Charge until all 3 battery charging lights are lit (approximately 2 hours).




Turning on the camera

Press the On/Off button to turn the camera on in Auto mode.

NOTE: You can also press the Auto/SCN, Video, or Favorites button to turn on the camera in that mode.



Setting the language and date/time



Storing pictures on an SD or MMC card

Your camera has internal memory. You can purchase an SD or MMC card to conveniently store more pictures/videos (www.kodak.com/go/v705accessories). We recommend Kodak SD or MMC cards.

NOTE: When using the card for the first time, format it in this camera before taking pictures. (See Format in the "Customizing your camera" table starting on page 32.)



CAUTION:

A card can only be inserted one way; forcing it may cause damage. Inserting or removing a card when the ready light is blinking may damage the pictures, the card, or the camera.

2 Taking pictures/videos

Taking a picture



- **1** Press the On/Off or the Auto/SCN button to turn on the camera.
- 2 Compose the picture.
- **3** Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure. When the Ready light turns green, press the Shutter button **completely down**.
- NOTE: You can repeatedly press Info/DIsplay **() ()** to turn on/off status icons, histogram, and framing grid.

Reviewing the picture just taken

After you take a picture/video, the LCD displays a quickview for approximately 5 seconds. (To exit the quickview sooner, press the Shutter button halfway.)



To review pictures/videos anytime, see page 16.

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Using the framing marks to take pictures

Framing marks indicate the camera focus area. The camera attempts to focus on foreground subjects, even if the subjects are not centered in the scene.




1 Press the Shutter button **halfway**.

When the framing marks turn green, focus is accomplished.

- **2** If the camera is not focusing on the desired subject (or if the framing marks disappear), release the Shutter button and recompose the scene.
- **3** Press the Shutter button **completely down** to take the picture.

NOTE: Framing marks do not appear in Landscape or Video mode. When you use Focus Zone and set Center Zone, the framing marks are fixed at Center Wide.

Taking a video




1 Press the Video mode button.

The camera enters Video mode.

2 Press the Shutter button **completely down**, then release it. To stop recording, press and release the Shutter button again.

Using optical zoom



1 Use the LCD to frame your subject.

When you turn on the camera, it is set to ultra-wide (23 mm) for the widest field of view.

2 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom.

The zoom indicator shows the zoom status. The Lens Transition icon indicates when the camera transitions from one lens to another.

To zoom out, press Wide Angle (W).

3 Take the picture or video.

NOTE: For focus distances, see page 53.


Using digital zoom

Use digital zoom in any picture-taking mode to get up to 4X magnification beyond optical zoom. (You cannot use digital zoom for video recording.)

- **1** Press Telephoto (T) until the slider is at the top of the optical zoom range. Release Telephoto (T), then press it again.
- 2 Take the picture.
- NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider pauses and turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.

Using the self-timer

Use the self-timer when you want to be included in a picture, or to ensure a steady Shutter button press. Place camera on a tripod or flat surface



- 1 In any Still mode (except SCN-Panorama), press the Menu button.
- 2 Press \checkmark to highlight Self-Timer, then press OK.
- **3** Press / to choose:

10 seconds—A picture is taken after a 10-second delay (so you have time to get into the scene).

2 seconds—A picture is taken after a 2-second delay (for a steady, auto-shutter release on a tripod).

2 shot—The first picture is taken after a 10-second delay. A second picture is taken 8 seconds later.

Press OK, then the Menu button.

- 4 Compose the scene.
- 5 Press the Shutter button **halfway**, then **completely down**.

The camera takes the picture/pictures after the delay.

Use the same procedure to take a video, but:

- Press the Video mode button .
- Press the Shutter button **completely down**.
- NOTE: The video stops when no storage space remains. Only the 2- and 10-second options are available in video mode.



Using the flash



Press the flash button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes.

The current flash mode is shown in the LCD status area.


Taking panoramic pictures

Use panorama to "stitch" up to 3 pictures into a panoramic scene.

- NOTE: For best results, use a tripod. Only the panoramic picture is saved; individual pictures are not. (Picture size is set to 5.0 MP. Exposure and white balance are set with the first picture. The flash is set to Off.)
- 1 Press the Auto/SCN button until the Scene icons appear on the LCD.
- 2 Press **∢/**▶ to highlight Panorama Left-Right or Panorama Right-Left (depending on the direction you want to pan), then press the OK button.
- **3** Take the first picture.

After a quickview, the LCD displays the liveview and an "overlay" from the first picture.

- **4** Compose the second picture. Make the overlay from the first picture cover the same portion in the new picture. (You can press the Delete button to re-take a picture.)
- **5** If you are taking only 2 pictures, press the OK button to stitch them together. *After you take 3 pictures, the pictures are automatically stitched together.*





Playing a video

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- Press 🔻 to play a video. Press the OK button to pause/unpause.
- Press Area during playback to adjust the volume.
- Press → during playback to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
- Press < to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.



Cropping pictures

You can crop a picture so that only the desired portion of the picture remains.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **√** to find a picture to crop.
- **2** Press the Menu button, choose Crop, then press the OK button.
- 3 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in, or ◀/▶ ▲/▼ to move the crop box. Press the OK button.
- 4 Follow the screen prompts.

The picture is cropped. (The original is saved.) Cropped pictures cannot be cropped again on the camera.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using Kodak Perfect Touch technology

Kodak Perfect Touch technology helps ensure better, brighter pictures.

- **1** Press the Review button.
- **2** Press **4**/**>** for previous/next picture.
- 3 Press the Menu button, choose Perfect Touch tech, then press the OK button. The enhancement is previewed in a split screen. Press ◀/► to view other parts of the picture.
- **4** Press the OK button. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the enhanced picture as a new one.

Enhanced pictures cannot be enhanced again on the camera. Kodak Perfect Touch technology can only be used with pictures, not video.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.




Editing videos

You can do incredible things with your videos!

Making a picture from a video

You can choose a single frame from a video, then make a picture suitable for a 4×6 -inch (10 x 15 cm) print.




- **1** Press the Review button, then **√** to find a video.
- **2** Press the Menu button, choose Make Picture, then press the OK button.
- **3** Follow the screen prompts.

A picture is created. (The original video is saved.)

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Trimming a video

You can trim an unwanted start or end from a video, saving only the desired portion.




- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, choose Edit Video, then press the OK button. Choose Trim, then press OK.
- **3** Follow the screen prompts.

The video is trimmed. (You can save it as a new video or replace the original.)

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Making a video action print

From a video, you can make a 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture, suitable for a 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- **2** Press the Menu button, choose Edit Video, then press the OK button. Choose Action Print, then press the OK button.
- Choose an option, then press the OK button.
 Auto: The camera includes the first and last frames, then 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.
 Manual: You choose the first and last frames; the camera chooses 2, 7, or 14 equally spaced frames.
 Full Manual: You choose 4, 9, or 16 frames.

A 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture is created. (The original video is saved.)

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Running a slide show

Use Slide Show to display your pictures/videos on the LCD.

NOTE: If you have an EasyShare photo frame dock 2, see page 23.

Starting the slide show

- **1** Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- 2 Press / to highlight Slide Show, then press the OK button.
- 3 Press ▲/→ to highlight Begin Show, then press the OK button. *Each picture/video is displayed once.*
- To interrupt the Slide Show, press the OK button.

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Changing the slide show display interval

The default interval setting displays each picture for 5 seconds. You can set the display interval from 3-60 seconds.

- 1 On the Slide Show menu, press ▲/ to highlight Interval, then press the OK button.
- **2** Select a display interval.

To scroll through the seconds quickly, press and hold $\checkmark/$.

3 Press the OK button.

The interval setting remains until you change it.

Running a continuous slide show loop

When you turn on Loop, the slide show is continuously repeated.

- 1 On the Slide Show menu, press / to highlight Loop, then press the OK button.
- 2 Press / to highlight On, then press the OK button.
- **3** Press \checkmark to highlight Begin Show, then press the OK button.

The slide show repeats until you press the OK button or until battery power is exhausted. The Loop feature remains until you change it.

Choosing a slide show transition


Choose how the slide show transitions from one picture to another.

- 1 On the Slide Show menu, press ▲/▼ to highlight Transition, then press the OK button.
- 2 Press \checkmark to select a transition, then press the OK button.

Displaying pictures/videos on a television


You can display pictures/videos on a television, computer monitor, or any device equipped with a video input. To connect the camera to a television, use the USB / A/V connector and A/V cable (may be sold separately).

NOTE: Ensure that the Video Out setting (NTSC or PAL) is correct. (See Video Out in the "Customizing your camera" table starting on page 32.) The slide show stops if you connect or disconnect the cable while the slide show is running. (Image quality on a television screen may not be as good as on a computer monitor or when printed.)






- **1** Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- 2 Press / to highlight View By, then press the OK button.

 - Press / to highlight a date or album, then press the T button. To return to the list of dates or albums, press the W button.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review.

Viewing picture/video information

- 1 Press the Review button.
- **2** Repeatedly press the Info/Display **1 D** button to turn on/off status icons, histogram, and picture/video info.
 - Press the Review button to exit Review.

Selecting multiple pictures/videos

Use the multi-select feature when you have two or more pictures/videos to print, transfer, delete, etc. (Multi-select is used most effectively in multi-up mode, page 24.)



- 1 Press the Review button, then **1** to find a picture/video.
- **2** Press the OK button to select pictures/videos.

A check mark appears on the picture. You can now print, transfer, delete, etc. the selected pictures. You can press OK a second time to remove a check mark.

Copying pictures/videos

You can copy pictures/videos from a card to internal memory or from internal memory to a card.

Before you copy, make sure that:

- A card is inserted in the camera.
- The camera's picture storage location is set to the location from which you are copying. (See Format in the "Customizing your camera" table starting on page 32.)


Copy pictures/videos:

- **1** Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- 2 Press / to highlight Copy >, then press the OK button.
- **3** Press / to highlight an option.
- 4 Press the OK button.
- NOTE: Pictures/videos are copied, not moved. To remove pictures/videos from the original location after copying, delete them (see page 17). Tags that you applied for print, email, and favorites are not copied. Protection settings are not copied. To apply protection to a picture/video, see page 17.



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Understanding the blur warning icons

A blur alert icon (1) is displayed during picture review and (if the feature is turned on) in quickview.

Green—Picture is sharp enough for an acceptable 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.

Yellow—Picture may be sharp enough for an acceptable 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print or sharpness is not determined. (You may want to view on a computer monitor before printing.)

Red—Picture is not sharp enough for an acceptable 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.

White—Print sharpness is not determined.

Using the menu to change settings

You can change settings to get the best results from your camera.

- NOTE: Some settings remain until you change them; others, until you turn the mode dial or turn off the camera. Some modes offer limited settings.
- 1 Press the Menu button.
- 2 Press \checkmark to highlight a setting, then press the OK button.
- **3** Choose an option, then press the OK button.

Camera takes up to 7 pictures while the Shutter button is pressed. Capture an expected event, such as a person swinging a golf club. Using exposure compensation to adjust picture brightness


Before you take a picture, you can adjust exposure compensation to make pictures darker or lighter.

- Press < to decrease exposure compensation.
- Press to increase exposure compensation.

The exposure compensation level is shown on the LCD; the LCD gets brighter or dimmer.

Using the histogram to view picture brightness


Use the histogram to evaluate the distribution of light before or after you take a picture. If the peak is to the right of the graph, the subject is bright; if it's to the left, the subject is dark. Optimal exposure is achieved when the peak is in the middle of the histogram. The flash may affect a picture's light and shadow.



To turn on the histogram in Capture mode or in Review, press the Info/Display ① [□] button until the histogram appears.

Using the framing grid to compose a picture

The framing grid divides the LCD into thirds—vertically and horizontally. This is helpful if, for example, you want to balance a picture between water, earth, and sky.



To turn on the framing grid in Auto/SCN mode, press the Info/Display ① IOI button until the grid appears.

Sharing your pictures

Press the Share button to tag your pictures/videos. When they are transferred to your computer, you can share them. Press the Share button to tag pictures/videos:

- Any time. (The most recent picture/video taken is then displayed.)
- Just after you take a picture/video, during quickview (see page 5).
- After pressing the Review button (see page 16).

Tagging pictures for printing

- 1 Press the Share button. Press **4**/**>** to find a picture.
- 2 Press \checkmark to highlight Print, then press the OK button.*
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to select the number of copies (0–99). Zero removes the tag for that picture.

The Print icon 🗋 appears in the status area. The default quantity is one.

- **4 Optional:** You can apply a print quantity to other pictures. Press **∢/** to find a picture. Keep the print quantity as is, or press **∧/** to change it. Repeat this step until the desired print quantity is applied to the pictures.
- **5** Press OK. Press the Share button to exit the menu.

* To tag all pictures in the storage location, highlight Print All, press OK, then indicate the number of copies. Print All is not available in quickview. To remove print tagging for all pictures in the storage location, highlight Cancel Prints, then press OK.





Index Print—Print thumbnails of all pictures. (This option requires one or more sheets of paper.) If the printer is capable, choose a print size.

All Pictures—Print all pictures in internal memory, on a card, or in Favorites. Choose the number of copies.

Image Storage—Access internal memory, a card, or Favorites.

NOTE: During direct printing, pictures are not permanently transferred or saved to the printer. To transfer pictures to your computer, see page 42. In Favorites mode, the current favorite picture is displayed.

Disconnecting the camera from a PictBridge enabled printer
