■ Use this camera in the following order.



Before connecting the camera to a PC, via the USB cable, you will need to set up the camera driver. Install the camera driver that is contained in Application software CD-BOM. (p.73)



Insert the USB cable

Insert the supplied USB cable into the PC's USB port and the camera's USB connection terminal. (p.75)



Check the camera's power. If the power is turned off, press the camera button to turn it on.



Open Windows EXPLORER and search for [Removable Disk]. (p.76)

• If you use a card reader to copy the images on the memory card to your PC, the images could be damaged. When transferring the images taken with the camera to your PC, be sure to use the supplied USB cable to connect the camera to your PC. Please note that the manufacturer accepts no responsibility for loss or damage of images on the memory card due to the use of a card reader.

- Do not insert or drop metallic or inflammable foreign objects into the camera through access points e.g. the memory card slot and battery chamber. This may cause a fire or electric shock.

 - There is the possibility of injury from the camera's moving parts.
- Battery and camera may become hot during prolonged use and it may result in camera malfunction. Should this be the case, let the camera sit idle for a few minutes to allow it time to cool.
- Do not leave this camera in places subject to extremely high temperatures, such as a sealed vehicle, direct sunlight or other places of extreme variances in temperature. Exposure to extreme temperatures may adversely affect the camera's internal components and could cause a fire.
- When in use, do not cover the camera or Charger. This may cause heat to build up and distort the camera body or cause a fire. Always use the camera and its accessories in a well-ventilated area.

- Do not move the camera while it is switched on when you are using the AC Charger. After use, always switch off the camera before unplugging the cable from the wall socket. Then make sure that any connector cords or cables to other devices are disconnected before moving the camera. Failure to do so may damage the cords or cables and cause a fire or electric shock.
- Take care not to touch the lens or lens cover to avoid taking an unclear image and possibly causing camera malfunction.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Before inserting any cables or AC adapter, check the directions and do not insert by force. It may cause breakage of cable or camera.
- Credit cards may be demagnetized if left near a camera case. Avoid leaving magnetic strip cards near the case.

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



Mode dial

You can select the desired working mode by using the mode dial located on the top of the camera.

AUTO mode



Select this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction.

PROGRAM mode



Selecting the program mode will configure the camera with optimal settings. You can still manually configure all functions except the aperture value and shutter speed.

ASM mode



You can manually configure all functions including the aperture value and shutter speed.

ASR mode



Advanced Shake Reduction (ASR) mode. This mode will reduce camera shake and help you get a clearer image.

• SPECIAL EFFECT mode



It is possible to add special effects to your images by using this mode.

SCENE mode



Use the menu to easily configure optimal settings for a variety of shooting situations.

MOVIE CLIP mode



A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time of the memory capacity allows.

• PHOTO GALLERY mode



The saved images can be reviewed with music or various effects in this mode

- You should use the rechargeable battery (SLB-1137D) supplied with the camera. Be sure to charge the battery before using the camera.

Connecting to a Power Source

INFORMATION

Important information about battery usage.

- When the camera is not used, turn off the camera power.
- Please remove the battery if the camera will not be used for long periods.
 Battery can lose power over time and are prone to leaking if kept inside the camera.
- Low temperatures (below 0°C) can affect the performance of the battery and you may experience reduced battery life.
- Battery will usually recover at normal temperatures.
- During extended use of the camera, the camera body may become warm.
 This is perfectly normal.

- You can charge the rechargeable battery (SLB-1137D) by using an SAC-45 KIT. The SAC-45 consists of the AC adapter (SAC-45) and the USB cable (SUC-C2). When the AC adapter and the USB cable are assembled, it can be used as an AC cable.
 - Using the SAC-45 as an AC charger
 - : Insert the AC adapter into the USB connector. When the AC adapter is inserted, it can be used as an AC charger.



- Using the SAC-45 as an USB cable
- : Remove the AC adapter from the USB connector. You can transmit data with a PC (p.75) or charge the battery.




CAUTION

In the following cases, the battery may not be charged.

- When using the USB cable that was not supplied with this camera. Use the supplied USB cable.
- When using a USB hub. Connect the camera to the PC directly.
- When other USB devices are connected to the PC. Disconnect the other USB devices.
- When the USB is connected to the USB port located on the front of the computer. Use the USB located on the back of the computer.
- If the USB port of the PC doesn't meet the Power output standard (5V, 500mA), the camera may not be charged.

CAUTION

- Before inserting any cables or AC adapter, check the directions and do not insert by force. It may cause damage to the cable or camera.
- If the charging LED of the AC Charger does not turn on or blink after inserting the rechargeable battery, please check whether the battery is inserted correctly.
- If you charge the battery with the camera power on, the battery can't charge fully. Turn the camera off while charging the battery.
- If you insert the fully discharged battery to charge it, do not turn on the camera at the same time. The camera may not be turned on because of the low battery capacity. Charge the battery for more than 10 minutes before using the camera.
- Do not use the flash frequently or take a movie clip with a fully discharged battery that has only been charged for a short time.

Connecting to a Power Source

- Insert the battery as shown
 - If the camera does not turn on after you have inserted battery, please check whether the battery is inserted with the correct polarity (+/-).
 - Do not use force to open the battery chamber. This may damage the battery chamber cover.

Inserting the memory card

- Turn off the camera's power before inserting the memory card.
 - Insert the memory card as shown.
 - Have the front of the memory card facing toward the back of the camera (LCD monitor) and the card pins toward the front of the camera (Lens).
 - Do not insert the memory card the wrong way round. Doing so may damage the memory card slot.



Instructions on using the memory card


- Be sure to format the memory card (see p.63) if you are using a newly purchased memory for the first time, if it contains data that the camera cannot recognise, or if it contains images captured with a different camera.
- Turn off the camera power whenever the memory card is being inserted or removed.
- Repeated use of the memory card will eventually reduce its performance.
 Should this be the case, you will need to purchase a new memory card.
 Wear and tear on the memory card is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
- The memory card is an electronic precision device.
 Do not bend, drop or subject it to any heavy impact.
- Do not store the memory card in an environment with strong electronic or magnetic fields, e.g. near loudspeakers or TV receivers.
- Please do not use or store in an environment where there are extremes in temperature.
- Do not allow the memory card to become dirty or to come into contact with any liquid. Should this happen, clean the memory card with a soft cloth.
- Please keep the memory card in its case when not in use.
- During and after periods of extended use, you may notice that the memory card is warm. This is perfectly normal.
- Do not use a memory card that is used in another digital camera.
 To use the memory card in this camera, format the memory card using this camera.
- Do not use a memory card formatted by another digital camera or memory card reader.

Instructions on using the memory card

- If the memory card is subjected to any of the following, the recorded data may become corrupted:
 - When the memory card is used incorrectly.
 - If the power is switched off or the memory card is removed while recording, deleting (formatting) or reading.
- Samsung cannot be held responsible for lost data.
- It is advisable to copy important data onto other media as back-up e.g. floppy disks. hard disks. CD etc.
- If there is insufficient memory available
 - : A [Memory Full!] message will appear and the camera will not operate.
 To optimise the amount of memory in the camera, replace the memory card or delete unnecessary images stored on the memory card.

INFORMATION

 Don't remove the memory card when the camera status lamp is blinking as this may cause damage to data in the memory card. The camera can use SD/SDHC Memory Cards and MMC (Multi Media Cards).
 When using MMC cards, please consult the instructions supplied with the cards.



[SD (Secure Digital) memory card]

The SD/SDHC memory card has a write protect switch that prevents image files from being deleted or formatted. By sliding the switch towards the bottom of the SD/SDHC memory card, the data will be protected. By sliding the switch towards the top of the SD/SDHC memory card, the data protection will be cancelled. Slide the switch to the top of the SD/SDHC memory card before taking a picture.

When using a 256MB MMC memory, the specified shooting capacity will be as follows. These figures are approximate as image capacities can be affected by variables such as subject matter and memory card type.



When Using the Camera for the First Time: Smart button

Touching the button1

This button is used for shifting the menu cursor to select or for confirming the selected menu.




Pressing the button]

To select a sub menu, in some menus, touch the button and slide your finger to the left / right.



[e.g.: Selecting the shutter speed]

Extending the menus: Press the extension menu button and more available menus will display.



** The LCD monitor will be dark when some menus are selected. After selecting the menu, the LCD monitor returns to the brightness set as before.

When Using the Camera for the First Time: Setting up the Date / Time and Language

- When the camera is turned on for the first time, a menu will be displayed in the LCD monitor to set date, time and language. This menu will not be displayed again after setting up the date, time and language. Set up the date, time and language before using this camera.
- Setting up the language
 - 1. Press the [Language] menu button.
 - 2. Select a desired language by pressing the vertical smart button.



- Setting up the date, time and date type
 - 1. Press the [Date&Time] menu button.
 - 2. Select a desired date type by pressing the vertical smart button.



- 3. To change the date, select the [2007/02/01] menu and press the vertical smart button.
- To select Year / Month / Day and Hour : Minute, press the horizontal smart button. To change the numbers, press the vertical smart button.




INFORMATION

- You can select any one of 22 languages. These are listed below:
 - English, Korean, French, German, Spanish, Italian, S.Chinese, T.Chinese, Japanese, Russian, Portuguese, Dutch, Danish, Swedish, Finnish, Thai, BAHASA (MALAY / INDONESIAN), Arabic, Polish, Hungarian, Czech and Turkish.

- How to use the AUTO mode (AUTO)

 Please select this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction
 - 1. Insert the battery (p.13) taking note of the correct polarity (+/-).
 - 2. Insert the memory card (p.13). As this camera has a 20MB internal memory, it is not essential to insert the memory card. If the memory card is not inserted, an image will be stored in the internal memory. If the memory card is inserted, an image will be stored on the memory card.
 - Close the battery chamber cover.
 - 4. Press the power button to turn on the camera. (If the date / time that is displayed on the LCD monitor is incorrect, reset the date / time before taking a picture.)
 - 5. Select the Auto mode by rotating the mode dial.
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- 7. Press the shutter button to capture an image.

INFORMATION

 If the auto focus frame turns to red when you press the shutter button down half way, it means that the camera cannot focus on the subject. Should this be the case, the camera is unable to capture an image clearly.





[AUTO mode]

- How to use the PROGRAM mode (P) Selecting the program mode will configure the camera with optimal settings. You can still manually configure all functions except the aperture value and shutter speed.
 - Select the Program mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - Press the horizontal smart button to configure advanced functions such as image size (p.31), quality (p.34), metering (p.32) and continuous shooting (p.32).

[PROGRAM mode]

- How to use the ASM mode (ASM)
 - How to select the A, S or M mode
 - 1. Select the ASM mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - 2. Select the A, S or M mode by using the smart button.





[A, S or M mode]

- How to use the APERTURE PRIORITY mode (A)
 This mode will set the aperture value for automatic exposure depends on the brightness of the object by automatic shutter speed setting in the camera.
 - Select the ASM mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - 2. Select the APERTURE PRIORITY mode (A) by using the smart button.
 - 3. Set the desired aperture value by using the smart button. (p.41)
 - Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
 - 5. Press the shutter button to capture an image.
 - Smaller Aperture values make the object sharp but blur the background. Larger Aperture values make both the object and background sharp.
- How to use the SHUTTER PRIORITY mode (S)
 This mode will set the shutter speed for automatic exposure depending on the brightness of the subject.
 - 1. Select the ASM mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - 2. Select the SHUTTER PRIORITY mode (S) by using the smart button.
 - 3. Set the desired shutter speed by using the smart button. (p.40)
 - Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
 - 5. Press the shutter button to capture an image.
 - # High Shutter speeds can 'freeze' a moving object as if it was not moving. Low Shutter speeds can capture a moving object with a blurred or 'active' effect.

- How to use the MANUAL mode (M)
 The user can manually set both the aperture value and the shutter speed.
 - 1. Select the ASM mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - Select the MANUAL mode (M) by using the smart button. (p.40~41)
 - 3. Select the desired shutter speed and aperture value by using the smart button.
 - Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
 - 5. Press the shutter button to capture an image.





[MANUAL mode]

■ How to use the ASR (Advanced Shake Reduction) mode (< () ASR)

This mode will reduce the effect of camera shake and help you get a well-exposed image in dim conditions.

[ASR mode]

- Things to watch out for using the ASR mode
 - 1. The digital zoom will not operate in the ASR mode.
 - If the lighting conditions are brighter than fluorescent lighting condition, the ASR doesn't activate
 - If the subject is moving the final image captured may be blurred.
 - Avoid moving the camera while the [Capturing!] message is displayed to achieve a better result.
 - As the ASR uses the camera's digital processor, images taken using the ASR may take a little longer for the camera to process.

[SPECIAL EFFECT mode]

- How to use the SCENE mode (SCENE)
 Use the menu to easily configure optimal settings for a variety of shooting situations.

 Select the Scene mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - * Refer to page 38 for more information about the menus.





[SCENE mode]

- How to use the MOVIE CLIP mode (♠) A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time of the memory capacity allows
 - Select the MOVIE CLIP mode by rotating the mode dial. (Available recording time will display on the LCD monitor)
 - Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor. Press the shutter button and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time allows. Movie clips will still be recorded if the shutter button is released.





[MOVIE CLIP mode]

- If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.
- * Image size and type are listed below.
- Image size: 640X480, 320X240 (Selectable)
- File type : *.avi (MPEG-4)
- * The maximum file size of continuous movie clip is 4GB.
- ** If the recording time is over 6 hours, though the file size is not 4GB, the movie is stopped and saved automatically.
- ** Before the file size is 4GB or the recording time is 6 hours, the movie can be stopped and saved depending on the movie quality.

- To record a movie clip without voice
 - 1. Press the extension menu button.
 - 2. Select the [VOICE] → [OFF] menu.
 - Press the shutter button and movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time without voice allows.



[MOVIE CLIP mode]

- Pausing while recording a movie clip (Successive Recording) This camera allows you to temporarily stop during unwanted scenes, while recording a movie clip. Using this function, you can record your favourite scenes into a movie clip without having to create multiple movie clips.
- Using Successive Recording
 - Press the shutter button and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time allows. Movie clips will still be recorded if the shutter button is released.
 - 2. Press the **II** button to pause recording. Press the **II** button again to resume the recording.
 - 3. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.




[Successive recording of a movie clip]

Things to Watch Out for When Taking Pictures

Pressing the shutter button down half way.
 Lightly press the shutter button to confirm focus and flash battery charge.
 Press the shutter button all way down to take the picture.







[Press the shutter button]

- The available recording time may vary depending on shooting conditions and camera settings.
- When either the Flash Off or Slow synchro mode is selected in a low lighting condition, the camera shake warning indicator ("\(\frac{n}{n}\)"\) may appear on the LCD monitor. In this case, use a tripod, support the camera on a solid surface or change to flash shot mode.
- Shooting against the light: Please do not take pictures into the sun. Taking a picture against the sun may make the picture dark. To take a picture against the light, please use the [Backlight] in the scene shooting mode (see page 38), fill-in flash (see page 30), spot metering (see page 32), or exposure compensation (see page 36).

- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- In some of the following conditions the auto focus system may not perform as expected.
 - When photographing a subject that has little contrast.
 - If the subject is highly reflective or shiny.
 - If the subject is moving at high speed.
 - When there is strong reflected light, or when the background is very bright.
 - When the subject matter has only horizontal lines or the subject is very narrow (such as a stick or flagpole).
 - When the surroundings are dark.

Using the camera buttons to set the camera

■ The recording mode function can be set up by using the camera buttons.

POWER button

- Used for turning the camera's power on / off.
- If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera's power will be turned off automatically to save battery life.
 Refer to page 62 for more information about the auto power off function.



Shutter button

- Used for taking an image or recording voice in the RECORDING mode.
- In MOVIE CLIP mode:
 Pressing the shutter button down fully starts the process for recording a movie clip.
 Press the shutter button once and the movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time in the memory allows. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.
- In STILL IMAGE mode:
 Pressing the shutter button down halfway activates the autofocus and checks the condition of the flash. Pressing the shutter button down fully takes and stores the image. If you select voice memo recording, the recording will start after the camera has finished storing the image data.

ZOOM W/T button

 If the menu is not displayed, this button works as the OPTICAL ZOOM or DIGITAL ZOOM button



- This camera has a 5X optical zoom and a 5X digital zoom function.
 Using both will offer a total zoom ratio of 25X.
- TELE Zoom

Optical zoom TELE: Pressing the ZOOM T button will zoom into the subject i.e. the subject will appear nearer.

Digital zoom TELE : \

: When the maximum (5X) optical zoom is selected, pressing the ZOOM T button activates the digital zoom software. Releasing ZOOM T button stops the digital zooming at the required setting. Once the maximum digital zoom (5X) is achieved, pressing the ZOOM T button will have no effect







- Images taken using the digital zoom may take a little longer for the camera to process. Allow time for this to take place.
- If the Zoom buttons are being pressed during the Movie clip shots, the voice will not recorded.
- You may notice a decrease in image quality when using the digital zoom.
- To view a clearer digital zoom image, press the shutter button halfway at the maximum optical zoom position and press the zoom T button again.
- The digital zoom can't be activated in the MOVIE CLIP, ASR, High Speed, Motion Capture mode, [Night], [Children], [Biz], [Close up], [Text] and [Fireworks] scene modes.
- Take care not to touch the lens to avoid taking an unclear image and possibly causing camera malfunction. If the image is dim, turn the camera power off and on again to modify the lens position.
- Take care not to press the lens as this may cause a camera malfunction.
- When the camera is turned on, take care not to touch the camera's moving lens parts as this may cause the resulting image to be dim and unclear.
- You can operate the Wide and Tele zoom by using the remote control.

Face recognition(FR) button

■ Face recognition

This mode detects the face position of the subject automatically and then sets the focus and exposure. Select this mode for quick and easy face picture. Selectable modes: Auto, Program, ASR, Effect(GIF), A/S/M, Scene(Portrait, Children, Beach & Snow)

1. Press the FR (Face Recognition) button (() in the selectable modes.

The FR icon will be displayed on the screen left side.



2. The size and position of the auto focus frame is set at the face of the subject automatically.

- The distance between the camera and object are far.
- The maximum available Face Recognition range is 2.1m (Wide).
- The nearer the subject, the faster the camera can recognize the subject.







 If you press the shutter button after selecting the Auto, Fill-in, Slow sychro flash, the first flash fires to check the shooting condition (Flash range and Power ratio of flash).

Do not move the camera until the second flash fires.

- Using the flash frequently will reduce the life of the battery.
- Under normal operating conditions the charging time for the flash is usually less than 5 seconds. If the battery is weak, the charging time will be longer.
- Take photographs within the flash range.
- The image quality is not guaranteed if the subject is too close or highly reflective.
- When taking an image in poorly lit conditions with the flash, there may be a
 white speck in the captured image. The speck is caused by the reflection of
 the flash light from the atmospheric dust. It is not camera malfuction.
- Do not open the Built-in flash by force. It may cause damage to the flash.

Continuous shot

- You can select the type of shooting and the number of continuous shots.
 - SINGLE : Take one picture only
 - CONTINUOUS: Images will be taken continuously until the shutter button is released.

Metering

: Only the rectangular area in the centre of the LCD monitor will be metered for

- light. This is suitable when you want the subject in the centre correctly exposed, regardless of the back lighting.
- CENTER: Exposure will be calculated based on an average of the available light in the image area. However, the calculation will be biased towards the centre of the image area. This is suitable for taking a picture of small object like a flower or insects.
- If the subject is not the centre of the focus area, do not use the spot metering as this may result in an exposure error. In this circumstance, it is better to use exposure compensation.

Sharpness

You can adjust the sharpness of the picture you want to take. You cannot check the sharpness effect on the LCD monitor before you take a picture. because this function is applied only when the captured image is stored on the memory.



- JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group): JPEG is the image compression standard developed by the Joint Photographic Experts Group.

Self-timer / Remote control



INFORMATION

- When taking a picture using the self-timer, the self-timer lamp works as follows:
 - 2 second self-timer setting : The self-timer lamp blinks at 0.25 second interval for 2 seconds.
 - 10 second self-timer setting: The self-timer lamp blinks at 1 second interval for the first 7 seconds. It blinks at 0.25 second interval for the remaining 3 seconds.
- If you operate the Back button during the self-timer operation, the self-timer function is canceled.
- Use a tripod to prevent camera shake.

Voice recording / Voice memo

 A voice can be recorded for as long as the available recording time(Max 10 hours) of the memory capacity allows. And you can add your voice-over to a stored still image.

 - 1. Select a recording mode with the exception of the Movie clip mode by rotating the mode dial.
 - 2. Select the Voice recording menu by using the smart button.
 - 3. Press the shutter button to record a voice.
 - Press the shutter button once and voice is recorded for as long as the available recording time allows(Max 10 hours). The recording time will be displayed on the LCD monitor. Voice will still be recorded if the shutter button is released
 - If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.

- Voice memo



You can increase the shutter speed while the same amount of light is present, by increasing the ISO sensitivity. However, the image may be saturated in high luminance.



The higher the ISO value, the greater is the camera's sensitivity to light; therefore it has a greater capacity for taking pictures in darker conditions. However, the noise level in the image will increase as the ISO value increases, making the image appear coarse.

** When the [M.CAPTURE] menu is selected, you only can select ISO AUTO, 400. 800. 1600.

White balance

■ The white balance control allows you to adjust the colours to appear more natural. When a menu except the AWB (Auto White Balance) is selected, you can only select the negative color effect.

White Balance menu is available in the Program. ASM and Movie clip mode.

AUTO : The camera automatically selects the appropriate white balance settings. depending on the prevailing lighting conditions.



- If you press the Play mode button or rotate the mode dial during the composite shots, each camera working mode is executed. The images captured before will be deleted.
- After taking the last composite shooting, press the OK button. And then the voice memo will start

Special Effect : Composite shooting

- Changing a part of composite shot before taking the last shot
 Before taking the last composite shot, you can change a part of composite shot.
 - 1. During the composite shots, press the BACK button.







Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

■ In Play mode, you can use the buttons on the camera to conveniently set up the Play mode functions.

Play mode button

- If you have turned on the camera by pressing the POWER button, you can press the PLAY MODE button once to switch to Play mode and press it again to switch to Recording mode.
- You can turn the power on with the play mode button. The camera is turned on in play mode. Press the play mode button again to turn off the camera.





Starting the slide show

Images can be displayed continuously at pre-set intervals.
 You can view the slide show by connecting the camera to an external monitor.
 To start the slide show, press the Start menu button.

 - MIX : The image slides regularly (from Effect 1 to Effect 3).

Protecting images

■ This is used to protect (Lock) specific shots from being accidentally erased. It also unprotects (Unlocks) images that have been previously protected.

ONE: Protect / release displayed image.
ALL: Protect / release all saved images

- If you protect an image, the protect icon will be displayed on the LCD monitor. (An unprotected image has no indicator)
- An image in LOCK mode will be protected from the delete function, but will NOT be protected from the format function.





Deleting images

■ This is used to delete the displayed image.

YES: deletes displayed or checked (✓) image.

NO: cancels deleting displayed image or checked
(✓) image.

- The protected images can't be deleted.
- If you wish to delete multi-image, check to delete the image by using the (\(\sqrt{} \) button and the smart button (horizontal) and then press the [Yes] menu.
- The number of images will display right bottom of the LCD monitor.





DPOF

- DPOF (Digital Print Order Format) allows you to embed printing information on your memory card's MISC folder. Select the pictures to be printed and how many prints to make.
- The DPOF indicator will display on the LCD monitor when an image that has DPOF information plays back. Images can then be printed on DPOF printers, or at an increasing number of photo labs.
- This function is not available for Movie clips and Voice recording files.
- If a memory card is not inserted, the menus are still displayed in the LCD, but are not selectable.

DPOF: STANDARD

- This function allows you to embed print quantity information on a stored image.
 - Select the DPOF menu by pressing the smart button.
 - 2. Select a desired sub menu by pressing the smart button.

[ONE PIC] : Select a number of prints of displayed image.

[ALL PICS] : Configure number of prints for all pictures except movie and voice

files

[CANCEL] : Cancel the print setup.







DPOF: Print size

INFORMATION

- You can change the resolution of only those files compressed in the JPEG 4:2:2 format.
- The resized image will have a new file name. The [START IMAGE] image is stored not on the memory card but on the internal memory.
- Only one [START IMAGE] image can be saved. If you save a new [START IMAGE], the existing startup image will be deleted.
- If the memory capacity is insufficient to store the resized image, a [Memory Full!] message will display on the LCD monitor and the resized image will not be stored.

Trimming

[Operation Sound]

Rough handling can damage the LCD monitor. Take care to avoid damage and keep the camera in a protective carrying case when not in use

- Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the camera.
- Under certain conditions, static electricity can cause the flash unit to fire. This
 is not harmful to the camera and is not a malfunction.
- When images are uploaded or downloaded, the data transfer may be affected by static electricity.

In this case, disconnect and re-connect the USB cable before trying the transfer again.

- Always check the condition of the camera before an important event or going on a trip.
 - Take a picture to check that the camera is working correctly and ensure you have a fully charged spare battery.







■ Please check the following if the USB connection malfunctions.

Case 1

USB cable is not connected or it is not the supplied USB cable.

→ Connect the supplied USB cable.

Case 2

The camera is not recognised by your PC.

Sometimes, the camera may appear under [Unknown Devices] in Device Manager.

→ Install the camera driver correctly. Turn off the camera, remove the USB cable, plug in the USB cable again, and then turn on the camera.

Case 3

There is an unexpected error during file transfer.

→ Turn the camera power off and on again. Transfer the file again.

Case 4

When using a USB hub.

→ There may be a problem in connecting the camera to the PC through a USB hub if the PC and the hub are not compatible. Wherever possible, connect the camera directly to the PC.

Case 5

Are other USB cables connected to the PC?

→ The camera may malfunction when it is connected to the PC at the same time as another USB cable. In this case, disconnect the other USB cable, and only connect the camera USB cable to the PC. Case 6

When I open the Device Manager (by clicking Start \rightarrow (Settings) \rightarrow Control Panel \rightarrow (Performance and Maintenance) \rightarrow System \rightarrow (Hardware) \rightarrow Device Manager), there are Unknown Devices or Other Devices entries with a yellow question mark (?) beside them or devices with an exclamation mark (!) beside them.




