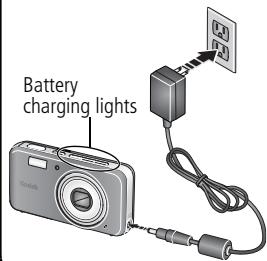


3 Charging the battery

5-volt AC adapter

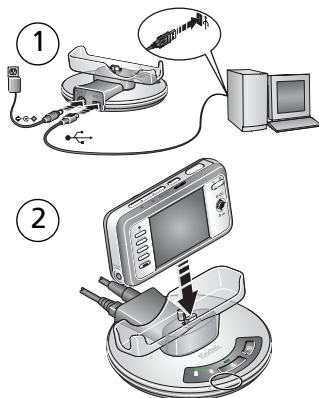

Battery charging lights blink during charging. Charge until all 3 lights stay lit (approximately 2 hours).



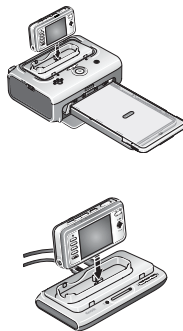

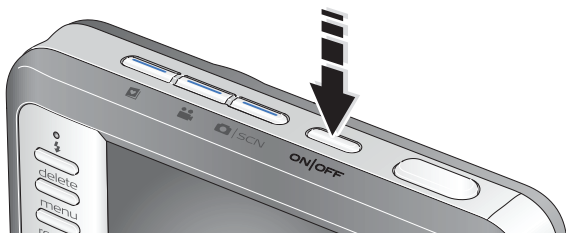

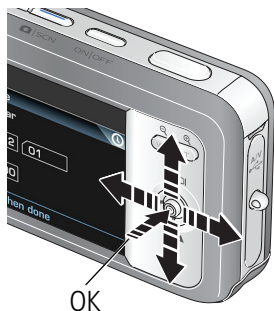

5 Setting the language, date/time



- Language:**
- 1 ▲/▼ to change.
 - 2 OK to accept.

- Date/Time:**
- 1 At the prompt, press OK.
 - 2 ▲/▼ to change.
◀/▶ for previous/next field.
OK to accept.

6 Taking a picture/video

Pictures



- 1 Press the On/Off or the Auto/SCN mode button to turn on the camera.
- 2 Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure.
When the Ready light or framing marks turn green, press the Shutter button **completely down**.

Videos



- 1 Press the Video mode button.
- 2 Press the Shutter button **completely down**, then release it.
To stop recording, press and release the Shutter button again.

7 Reviewing pictures/videos



- 1 Press Review.
(Press again to exit.)
- 2 ◀/▶ for previous/next.

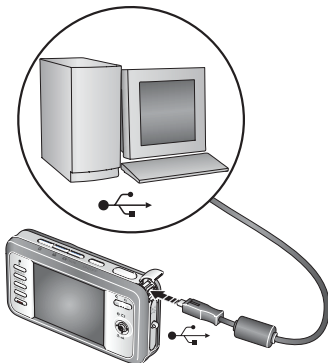
Videos:

- ▼ Play. (Press OK to pause/unpause.)
- ▲/▼ During playback to adjust the volume.
- ▶ During playback to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
- ◀ During playback to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
- ◀/▶ Press and hold for 4 seconds to jump to a bookmark.

1 Doing more with your camera

Using optical zoom



- 1 Use the LCD to frame your subject.
- 2 To zoom in, press Telephoto (T).
To zoom out, press Wide Angle (W).
The zoom indicator shows the zoom status.
- 3 Take the picture or video.

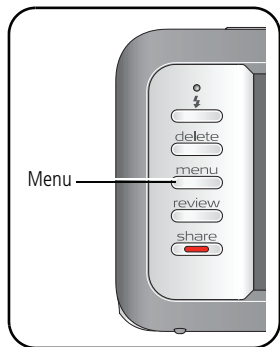
Using digital zoom

Use digital zoom in any picture-taking mode to get up to 3X magnification beyond optical zoom. (You cannot use digital zoom for video recording.) Press Telephoto (T) until the slider is at the top of the optical zoom range. Release (T), then press it again.

NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider pauses and turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.

Using the self-timer

Use the self-timer when you want to be included in a picture, or to ensure a steady Shutter button press. Place camera on a tripod or flat surface



- 1 In any Still mode, press the Menu button.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Self-Timer, then press OK.
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to choose:

10 seconds—A picture is taken after a 10-second delay (so you have time to get into the scene).


2 seconds—A picture is taken after a 2-second delay (for a steady, auto-shutter release on a tripod).

2 shot—The first picture is taken after a 10-second delay. A second picture is taken 8 seconds later.

- 4 Press OK, then the Menu button.
- 5 Compose the scene. Press the Shutter button **halfway**, then **completely down**.

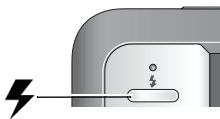
The camera takes the picture/pictures after the delay.

Use the same procedure to take a video, but:

- Press the Video mode button .
- Press the Shutter button **completely down**.





NOTE: The video stops when no storage space remains. Only the 2- and 10-second options are available in video mode.

Using the flash











Press the flash button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes.

The current flash mode is shown in the LCD status area.

Flash modes	Flash fires
 Auto	When the lighting conditions require it.
 Fill	Every time you take a picture, regardless of the lighting conditions. Use when the subject is in shadow or is “backlit” (when light is behind the subject). In low light, hold the camera steady or use a tripod.
 Red Eye	<p>In Red Eye flash, you can reduce red-eye by using a preflash or by using automatic red eye reduction. To make the camera:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Preflash, turn the Red Eye Preflash on. (The first flash shrinks the eye pupil to reduce the chance of red eye.) ■ Flash once and automatically remove red eye, turn the Red Eye Preflash off. <p>NOTE: When automatic red eye reduction is on, the camera cannot take more than 2 pictures in quick succession. Take more pictures when the Ready light turns green.</p>
 Off	Never

 SCN	Scene: Point-and-shoot simplicity when taking pictures under special conditions. (See page 15 .)	
	Video: Capturing video with sound. (See page 5 .)	
	Favorites: Viewing favorite pictures.	
	Landscape: Far-away scenes. The camera uses infinity auto-focus. Auto-focus framing marks are not available in Landscape.	 <p data-bbox="609 736 902 781">Press until the Macro or Landscape icon appears in the LCD status area.</p>
	Macro: Close range. The camera automatically sets the focus distance depending on the zoom position. Use available light instead of flash, if possible.	

Using Scene (SCN) modes

Choose a Scene mode—for great pictures in practically any situation!

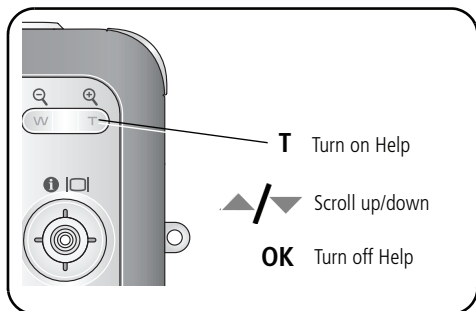
- 1 Press the Auto/SCN button until the Scene icons appear on the LCD.
- 2 Press to view scene mode descriptions.

The date/time and the mode description appear. If the mode description turns off before you finish reading it, press the OK button.

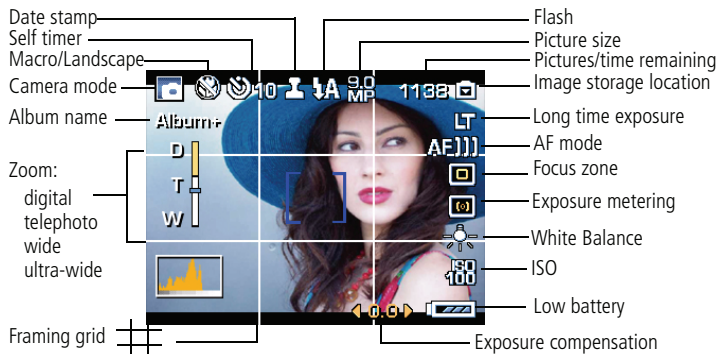
- 3 Press the OK button to choose a Scene mode.

2 Working with pictures/videos

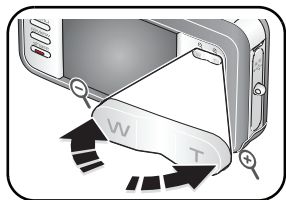
Reviewing pictures/videos

Press the Review button to view and work with your pictures/videos.



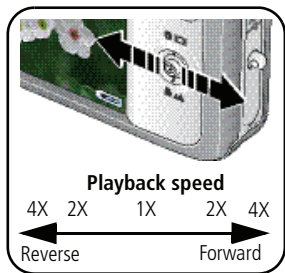
- 1 Press the Review button.
- 2 Press ◀/▶ for previous/next picture/video.






Magnifying a picture



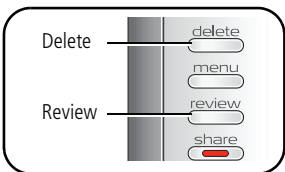
- 1 Press T to magnify 1X–8X.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ ◀/▶ to view other parts of a picture.
- 3 Press the OK button to return to 1X.


Playing a video



- Press  to play a video. Press the OK button to pause/unpause.
- Press  during playback to adjust the volume.
- Press  during playback to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
- Press  to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
- Press and hold  for 4 seconds to jump to a bookmark.

Deleting pictures/videos



- 1 Press the Review button.
- 2 Press  for previous/next picture/video.
- 3 Press the Delete button.
- 4 Follow the screen prompts.

Using the undo delete feature

If you accidentally delete a picture, you may be able to use Undo Delete to retrieve it. This feature is only available immediately after you delete a single picture.

Using Kodak Perfect Touch technology

Kodak Perfect Touch technology helps ensure better, brighter pictures.

- 1 Press the Review button, then ◀/▶ for previous/next picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button, choose Perfect Touch tech, then press OK.
The enhancement is previewed. Press ◀/▶ to view other parts of the picture.
- 3 Press OK. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the enhanced picture as a new one.

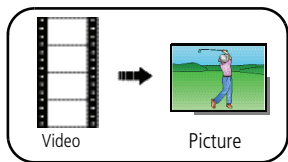
Enhanced pictures cannot be enhanced again on the camera. Kodak Perfect Touch technology can only be used with pictures, not video.

- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Editing videos

Making a picture from a video

You can choose a single frame from a video, then make a picture suitable for a 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



- 1 Press the Review button, then ◀/▶ to find a video.
- 2 Press Menu, choose Make Picture, then press OK.
- 3 Follow the screen prompts.

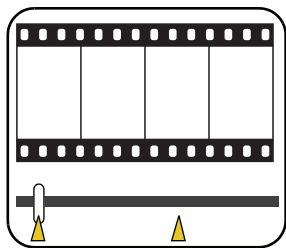
A picture is created. (The original video is saved.)

- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Using video bookmarks

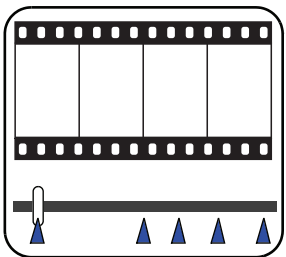
You can set bookmarks at interesting places in your video, then jump from one bookmark to another.

Setting bookmarks



- 1 Press the Review button, then ◀/▶ to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, choose Edit Video, then press the OK button. Choose Bookmark, then press OK.
- 3 Press ▼ to add bookmarks. When finished adding up to 9 bookmarks, press ▲.
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

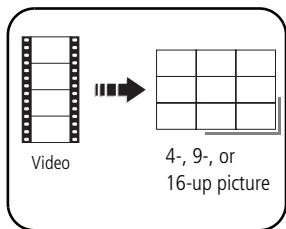
Using bookmarks



- 1 Press the Review button, then ◀/▶ to find a video.
- 2 Press ▼ to play the video. To jump to the first bookmark, press and hold ◀/▶ for 4 seconds while the video is playing.
 - After you jump to a bookmark, press ◀/▶ to jump to other bookmarks.
 - To view all bookmarked video frames, press the Zoom wide angle (W) button. To return to normal view, press the telephoto (T) button.

Making a video action print

From a video, you can make a 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture, suitable for a 4 x 6-inch (10 x 15 cm) print.



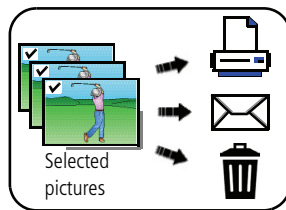
- 1 Press the Review button, then ◀/▶ to find a video.
- 2 Press the Menu button, choose Edit Video, then press the OK button. Choose Action Print, then press the OK button.
- 3 Choose an option, then press the OK button.

A 4-, 9-, or 16-up picture is created. If you have less than 4 or 9 bookmarks, equally-spaced video frames are used.

- Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Selecting multiple pictures/videos

Use the multi-select feature when you have two or more pictures/videos to print, transfer, delete, etc.



- 1 Press the Review button, then ◀/▶ to find a picture/video.
- 2 Press the OK button to select pictures/videos.

A check mark appears on the picture. You can now print, transfer, delete, etc. the selected pictures. You can press OK a second time to remove a check mark.

3 Solving camera problems

Camera problems

Status	Solution
Camera does not turn on	■ Make sure the battery is charged and installed correctly (page 2).
Camera does not turn off and the lens does not retract	
Camera buttons and controls do not function	
Lens does not extend when camera turns on or does not retract	■ Make sure the battery is charged and installed correctly (page 2). ■ Turn the camera off, then on again. (The lens does not extend in Favorites mode.)
In Review, a blue or black screen is displayed instead of a picture	■ Transfer <i>all</i> pictures to the computer (page 7). ■ Take another picture. If the problem continues, change the image storage location to internal memory.
Flash does not fire	■ Check the flash setting, and change as needed (page 13). NOTE: The flash does not fire in all modes.

Important safety instructions

- If you suspect water has gotten inside the camera, remove the battery and card. Allow all components to air-dry for at least 24 hours before using the camera.
- Blow gently on the lens or LCD to remove dust and dirt. Wipe gently with a soft, lint-free cloth or an untreated lens-cleaning tissue. Do not use cleaning solutions unless designed specifically for camera lenses. Do not allow chemicals, such as suntan lotion, to contact painted surfaces.
- Service agreements may be available in your country. Contact a dealer of Kodak products for more information.
