#### **INFORMATION**

#### Important information about battery usage

- When the camera is not used, turn off the camera power.
- Please remove the battery if the camera will not be used for long periods.
   Battery can lose power over time and are prone to leaking if kept inside the camera.
- Low temperatures (below 0°C) can affect the performance of the battery and you may
  experience reduced battery life.
- Battery will usually recover at normal temperatures.
- During extended use of the camera, the camera body may become warm.
   This is perfectly normal.

Using the SAC-41

If you have access to a mains supply, using an SAC-41 allows the camera to be used for long periods of time.

Plug the SAC-41 into the DC connection terminal on the camera or cradle.


Before turning on the camera power with an SAC-41, insert the rechargeable battery that was charged for over 10 minutes with turning off the camera.

### **DANGER**

- Always turn off the power before taking the SAC-41 out of the mains supply.
- As with all mains powered devices, safety is important. Ensure that neither the camera nor Charger comes into contact with water or metallic materials.
- Please ensure that you use the SAC-41 with the correct specification for the camera.
   Failure to do so may affect your warranty.
- How to charge the rechargeable battery (SLB-0737) with the SAC-41.
  - · Charging with the cradle
    - Insert the rechargeable battery into the battery chamber.




- 2. Place the camera correctly in the cradle.
- Put the SAC-41 into your power socket and DC connection terminal of the cradle.




- How to charge the rechargeable battery (SLB-0737) with the SAC-41.
  - Charging with the camera
    - 1. Insert the rechargeable battery into the battery chamber.
    - 2. Put the SAC-41 into your power socket and DC connection terminal of the camera.





- Important information about battery (SLB-0737) charging with the SAC-41
  - If the charging LED of the SAC-41 does not turn on or blink after inserting the rechargeable battery, please check whether the battery are inserted correctly.
  - Please check the battery charging status with the charging LED of SAC-41.



If you connect the SAC-41 to camera without inserting the rechargeable battery, the charging LED will brink or be off. In this case, insert the battery and connect the SAC-41 again.

- If there is a charging error, please check all the power connections are in place.
- A USB cable for transmitting data can't be used for charging the rechargeable battery.
- A USB cable for recharging the battery is optional.
  - When the USB cable is inserted into the connection terminal of the camera, you can charge the battery and tramsmit data at the same time.
  - When the USB cable is inserted into the DC connection terminal of the cradle, you can charge the battery. When the USB cable is inserted into the USB port of the cradle, you can transmit data
- Charging time (When the camera is turned off)

- Using the cradle : About 150MIN
- Using the SAC-41 : About 150MIN
- Using the USB cable: About 150MIN

#### INFORMATION

#### Important information about the rechargeable battery.

- If you charge the battery with the camera power on, the battery can't charge fully.
   To charge the battery fully, turn the camera off when you charge it.
- If you insert the fully discharged battery to charge it, do not turn on the camera at the same time. The camera may not be turned on because of the low battery capacity.
   Charge the battery for over 10 minutes to use the camera.
- Do not use the flash frequently or take a movie clip with the fully discharged battery
  charged for a short time. Even if the charger is inserted, the camera power may be turned
  off because the rechargeable battery is discharged again.

Using the battery

: If the camera does not turn on after you have inserted battery, please check whether the battery are inserted with the correct polarity(+/-).

1. Open the battery chamber cover by pushing in the direction of the arrow.



2. Insert the battery taking note of the polarity (+ / -).



To close the battery chamber cover, push it until it clicks.



#### Removing the battery

- Turn off the camera power.
   Open the battery chamber cover and move the battery holder aside. The battery will be released.
- 2. Take out the battery and close the battery chamber cover



#### INFORMATION

- When the battery chamber cover is opened, do not press the battery chamber cover by force. This may cause the battery chamber cover modification or breakage.
- There are 4 indicators for battery condition that are displayed on the LCD monitor.


### Instructions on how to use the memory card

- Be sure to format the memory card (see p.97) if you are using a newly purchased memory for the first time, if it contains data that the camera cannot recognise, or if it contains images captured with a different camera.
- Turn off the camera power whenever the memory card is being inserted or removed.
- Repeated use of the memory card will eventually reduce the memory card's performance.
   Should this be the case, you will need to purchase a new memory card.
   Wear and tear on the memory card is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
- The memory card is an electronic precision device.
   Do not bend, drop or subject the memory card to any heavy impact.
- Do not store the memory card in an environment with strong electronic or magnetic fields, e.g. near loud speakers or TV receivers.
- Please do not use or store in an environment where there are extremes in temperature.
- Do not allow the memory card to become dirty or to come into contact with any liquid.
   Should this happen, clean the memory card with a soft cloth.
- Please keep the memory card in its case when not in use.
- During and after periods of extended use, you may notice that the memory card is warm.
   This is perfectly normal.
- Do not use a memory card that is used in another digital camera.
   To use the memory card in this camera, format the memory card using this camera.
- Do not use a memory card formatted by another digital camera or memory card reader.
- If the memory card is subjected to any of the following, the recorded data may become corrupted:
  - When the memory card is used incorrectly.
  - If the power is switched off or the memory card is removed while recording, deleting (formatting) or reading.
- Samsung cannot be held responsible for lost data.
- It is advisable to copy important data onto other media as back-up e.g. floppy disks, hard disks, CD etc.
- If there is insufficient memory available
  - : A [Card Full!] message will appear and the camera will not operate. To optimise the amount of memory in the camera, replace the memory card or delete unnecessary images stored on the memory.

### Instructions on how to use the memory card

#### **INFORMATION**

- Don't remove the memory card when the camera status lamp is blinking as this may cause damage to data in the memory card.
- The camera can use SD Memory Cards and MMC (Multi Media Cards).Please consult the enclosed manual for using the MMC Cards.



[ SD (Secure Digital) memory card ]

The SD memory card has a write protect switch that prevents image files from being deleted or formatted. By sliding the switch to the bottom of the SD memory card, the data will be protected. By sliding the switch to the top of the SD memory card, the data protection will be cancelled.

Slide the switch to the top of the SD memory card before taking a picture.

When using a 32MB memory, the specified shooting capacity will be as follows. These figures are approximate as image capacities can be affected by variables such as subject matter and memory card type.



# Inserting the memory card

 Turn off the camera's power and pull the battery chamber cover in the direction of the arrow to open.



Have the front of the memory card facing toward the front of the camera (lens) and the card pins toward the back of the camera (LCD monitor), and then push the memory card into the card slot until you hear a click.



3. To close, push the battery chamber cover until you hear a click. If the memory card does not slide in smoothly, do not attempt to insert it by force. Check the direction of insertion, and then insert it correctly. Do not insert the memory card the wrong way round. Doing so may damage the memory card slot.



### Removing the memory card

 Turn the power off using the power button.
 Open the battery chamber cover and press the memory card as shown in the image and release.



2. Remove the memory card and close the battery chamber cover

### **INFORMATION**

 When the camera is turned on, inserting or removing the memory card turns the camera power off.

# When Using the Camera for the First Time

- Charge the rechargeable battery fully before using the camera for the first time.
- When the camera is turned on for the first time, a menu will be displayed to set date, time and language in the LCD monitor. This menu will not be displayed after setting up the date, time and language. Set up the date, time and language before using this camera.
- Setting up the date, time and date type
  - Select the [Date&Time] menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - Select the desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN/ LEFT/ RIGHT button.

RIGHT button : selects YEAR/ MONTH/ DAY/ HOUR/


MINUTE/ DATE TYPE

LEFT button : Moves the cursor to the [Date&Time]

main menu if the cursor is at the first item of the date and time setup. In all other instances, the cursor will be shifted to the left of its current

position.

UP/ DOWN button : changes the value of each item.



- Select the [Language] menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
- Select the desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

When the settings are complete, press the MENU button twice to exit the menu screen.



### Changing the recording mode

- You can select the desired working mode using the M (Mode) button located on the back of the camera and then the [Mode], [Mode set] menu. Auto, manual, Voice Recording, movie clip and scene (night, portrait, children, landscape, text, close-up, sunset, dawn, backlight, fireworks, beach & snow) camera modes are available. Refer to page 106 for more information about the MP3 mode.
- Selecting the [Mode] menu
  - 1. Insert the battery (p.17).
  - Insert the memory card (p.20). As this camera has a 48MB internal memory, you do not need to insert the memory card. If the memory card is not inserted, an image will be stored in the internal memory. If the memory card is inserted, an image will be stored on the memory card.
  - 3. Close the battery chamber cover.
  - 4. Press the power button to turn on the camera.
  - 5. Press the menu button and a menu will display.
  - 6. Use the UP/DOWN button to select the [Mode] menu.
  - Select [Still/ Movie/ MP3] or [Full] sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button.
    - [Still/ Movie/ MP3]: A still image mode that was selected in the [Mode set] menu and movie clip mode can be selected.

Refer to page 49 for more information about using the [Mode set] menu.


- [Full] : Auto, Manual, Voice Recording, Movie clip and scene modes can be selected.
- 8. Press the MENU button and the menu will disappear.



# Changing the recording mode

- Changing the recording mode: If the [Still/Movie/MP3] menu was selected Steps from 1-4 are the same as those for selecting the [Mode] menu.
  - A recording mode used just before will display.
  - 6. Press the M (Mode) button located on the back of the camera and the recording mode will change to the movie clip mode.
  - 7. Press the M (Mode) button twice and a still image mode selected on the [Mode set] menu will be selected.





  - A recording mode used just before will display.
  - 6. Press the M (Mode) button located on the back of the camera and the mode selection menu will display.
  - 7. To select the Auto, Manual, Voice Recording, MP3, Movie clip or Scene modes, press the Left/Right button. To move between the Auto, Manual, Voice Recording, Movie clip menu line and Scene menu line, press the Up/Down button.

8. Press the M (Mode) button and the mode selection menu will disappear.

- How to use the Auto mode
   Use this for shooting basic still images.
  - 1. Select the [Full] sub menu on the [Mode] menu (p.23).
  - Select the Auto mode by pressing the M (Mode) button (p.24).
  - Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
  - 4. Press the shutter button to capture an image.

#### **INFORMATION**

- If the auto focus frame turns to red when you press the shutter button down half way, it
  means that the camera cannot focus on the subject. Should this be the case, the camera
  is less likely to capture an image clearly.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- How to use the Movie clip mode

A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time of the memory capacity allows.

- 1. Select the [Full] sub menu on the [Mode] menu (p.23).
- Select the Movie clip mode by pressing the M (Mode) button (p.24).
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- Press the shutter button once and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time allows. Movie clips will still be recorded if the shutter

button is released. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.

\* Image size and type are listed below.

- Image size : 640X480, 320X240, 160X128 (user selectable)

- Movie clip file type: AVI (MPEG-4)

- Recording the movie clip without voice You can record the movie clip without voice. Steps from 1-3 are the same as those for MOVIE CLIP mode.
  - Press the Up button and the ( ) icon will display on the LCD monitor.
  - Press the shutter button and movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time without voice.
  - 6. To stop the recording, press the shutter button again.



- Pausing while recording a movie clip (Successive Recording)
  This camera allows you to temporarily stop during unwanted scenes, while recording a movie clip. Using this function, you can record your favourite scenes into a movie clip without having to create multiple movie clips.
- Using Successive Recording Steps from 1-2 are the same as those for MOVIE CLIP mode.





- The available recording time may vary depending on shooting conditions and camera settings.
- When the Flash Off or Slow synchro mode is selected in a low lighting condition, the camera shake warning indicator ( ") may appear on the LCD monitor. In this case, support the camera on a solid surface or change the flash mode to flash shot mode.
- Backlight compensated shots: When taking an outdoor shot, avoid facing the sun, as the image may be dark because of the strong backlight.

  To take a picture against the sun, please use the [Backlight] in the scene shooting mode (see page 27), Fill-in flash (see page 36), Spot metering (see page 52), or Exposure compensation (see page 44).
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Under certain conditions the auto focus system may not perform as expected.
  - When photographing a subject that has little contrast.
  - If the subject is highly reflective or shiny.
  - If the subject is moving at high speed.
  - When there is strong reflected light, or when the background is very bright.
  - When the subject matter has only horizontal lines or the subject is very narrow (such as a stick or flagpole).
  - When the surroundings are dark

# Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

■ The recording mode function can be set up by using the camera buttons.

#### POWER button

- Used for turning the camera's power on / off.
- If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera's power will be turned off automatically to save battery life. Refer to page 96 for more information about the auto power off function.



#### SHUTTER button

- Used for taking an image or recording voice in the recording mode.
- In MOVIE CLIP mode
   Pressing the shutter button down fully starts the process for recording a movie clip. Press the shutter button once and the movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time in the memory allows. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.



In STILL IMAGE mode

Pressing the shutter button down halfway activates the autofocus and checks the condition of the flash.

Pressing the shutter down fully takes the image and stores the relevant data regarding the shot. If you select voice memo recording, the recording will start after the camera has finished storing the image data.

### **ZOOM W/T button**

 If the menu is not displayed, this button works as the OPTICAL ZOOM or DIGITAL ZOOM button.





#### **Focus lock**

- To focus on the subject positioned outside of the centre, use the focus lock function.
- Using the Focus Lock
  - 1. Ensure the subject in the centre of the autofocus frame.
  - Press the SHUTTER button halfway. When the green auto focus frame lights up, it means the camera is focused on the subject. Be careful not to press the SHUTTER button all the way down to avoid taking an unwanted picture.
  - 3. With the SHUTTER button still pressed down only halfway, move the camera to recompose your picture as desired, and then press the SHUTTER button completely to take the picture. If you release your finger from the SHUTTER button, the focus lock function will be cancelled.

- When the flash is charging, a flash mode icon (red colour) will blink on the LCD monitor.



## Self-timer ( 🚫 )/ Right button

- When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, pressing the Right button makes the cursor shift to the right tab. The right button can also be used to move to a sub menu to select a different setting. When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the RIGHT button operates as the Self-timer. This function is used when the photographer would also like to be in the image.
- Using the self-timer
  - 1. Press the M (Mode) button to select a still image mode or movie clip mode (p.24).
  - Press the Self-timer button until the desired mode indicator displays on the LCD monitor. In Movie clip mode, only the 10 Sec. self-timer can be used.







### SF button

- Pressing the SF button selects the SF(Safety Flash) mode In poor indoor light conditions, Safety Flash will help you get a good image without the use of a flash. As children are sensitive of using flash, this is suitable function for taking children.
- Things to watch out for using the SF mode
  - 1. The SF range is 2m(WIDE) and 1.5m(TELE).
  - 2. The digital zoom will not operate in the SF mode.
  - If the lighting conditions are brighter than fluorescent lighting condition, the SF doesn't activate.
  - 4. If the lighting condition is darker than in fluorescent lighting condition, camera shake warning indicator ( ") ) will display. Take a picture in a place where the camera shake warning indicator is not displayed and you will get clear image.
  - If the subject is moving the final image captured may be blurred.
  - Avoid moving the camera while the [Capturing!] message is displayed to achieve a better result.
  - As the SF uses the camera's digital processor, images taken using the SF may take a little longer for the camera to process.







- RGB: Allows the user to adjust the R (Red), G (Green), and B (Blue) values of the images to be captured.
- Setting RGB Values
  - Press the +/- button, and then use the UP and DOWN buttons to select the RGB icon ( RGB ).
     The RGB menu bar will appear as shown.
  - Use the UP/ DOWN/ LEFT and RIGHT buttons to select the desired RGB value.
    - Up/ Down Button: Navigates between R, G, and B icons.







### Metering

If you cannot obtain suitable exposure conditions, you can change the metering method to take brighter pictures.

[Multi] ( 🔳 )

Exposure will be calculated based on an average of the available light in the image area. However, the calculation will be biased towards the centre of the image area. This is suitable for general use.

[Spot] ( • )

: Only the rectangular area in the centre of the LCD monitor will be metered for light. This is suitable when the subject in

# Voice ( 🖢 ) memo/ Up button

  - 4. Press the MENU/ OK button and the slide show will stop.





- Playing a desired album
- 1. Select a desired album and press the OK button.
- Select [Slide] menu by pressing the Up/Down button and press the Right button.
  - \* You can select [Start], [Interval], [Repeat] and [Effect] menu.
- Select the [Start] menu and press the OK button to start the slide show.
- 4. Press the MENU/ OK button and the slide show will stop.





- If an image is deleted from the memory, the image doesn't display on an album.
- An image can't be added twice into the same album.
- An image can be added into the different albums.

# Setting up the play back function using the LCD monitor

## Starting the slide show

- Images can be displayed continuously at pre-set intervals.
   You can view the slide show by connecting the camera to an external monitor.
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - 2. Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Slide] menu tab.
- Start the slide show: The slide show can start only in the [Start] menu.
  - 1. Use the Up/Down buttons to select the [Start] menu.
  - 2 Press the OK button to start the slide show
  - Press the Pause button to pause the slide show.
  - Press the Pause button ( ) again to resume the slide show.
  - To stop the slide show, press the play & pause button, and then press the LEFT or RIGHT button.



- Setting play interval: Set the slide show play interval.
  - Select the [Interval] sub menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - 2. Use the Up/ Down buttons to select the desired interval.
  - 3. Press the OK button to save the configuration.



- Repeat setting: Setting the slide show to repeat after the first cycle.
  - Use the Up/ Down buttons to select the [Repeat] menu and press the Right button.
  - Use the Up/Down buttons to select the desired sub menu.

    [On] selected : The slide show is repeated until cancelled.

    [Off] selected : The slide show is closed after one cycle.
  - 3. Press the OK button to save the configuration.



- The loading time depends on the image size and quality.
- While the slide show is playing, only the first frame of a MOVIE file is displayed.
- While the slide show is playing, the voice recording file will not display.

# Starting the slide show

- Configure slide show effects: Unique screen effects can be used for the slide show.
  - Select the [Effect] sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.

# **Protecting images**

- This is used to protect specific shots from being accidentally erased (Lock).
   It also unprotects images that have been previously protected (Unlock).
- Protecting Images
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Protect] menu tab.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

[Select]: Selection window for an image to be protected/released is displayed.

- Up/Down/Left/Right : Select an image

- Zoom W/T Button : Protect/release the image

- Menu Button : Your changes will be saved and

the menu will disappear.

[All Pics]: Protect/release all saved images

- Zoom W/T Button : Protect/release the images

- Menu Button : Your changes will be saved and the

menu will disappear.







- If you protect an image, the protect icon will be displayed on the LCD monitor. (An unprotected image has no indicator)
- An image in LOCK mode will be protected from the delete function or [Delete] functions, but will NOT be protected from the [Format] function.



## **Deleting images**

- Of all the files stored in the memory card, the unprotected files in the DCIM subfolder will be deleted. Remember that this will permanently delete unprotected images. Important shots should be stored on a computer before deletion takes place. The startup image is stored in the camera's internal memory (i.e., not on the memory card) and it will not be deleted even if you delete all files on the memory card.
- Deleting images
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Delete] menu tab.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

 After deletion, the screen will be changed to the play mode screen.







### Resize

- Change the resolution (size) of pictures taken. Select [User image] to save an image to be the start-up image. The resized image will have a new file name.
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Resize] menu tab.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

- A large sized image can be resized to a smaller sized image, but not vice versa.
- Only JPEG images can be resized. Movie clip(AVI) and Voice recording(WAV) files can't be resized.
- You can change the resolution of only those files compressed in the JPEG 4:2:2 format.
- The resized image will have a new file name. The [User Image] image is stored not on the memory card but on the internal memory.
- Only two [User Image] images can be saved. If you save a new [User Image] image, the
  existing startup image will be deleted in order.
- If the memory capacity is insufficient to store the resized image, a [Card Full!] message will display on the LCD monitor and the resized image will not be stored.

### **Effect**

- By using the camera's digital processor, it is possible to add special effects to your images.
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - 2. Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Effect] menu tab.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button.

[B & W] : Captured images will be stored in black and

white

[Sepia] : Captured images will be stored in a sepia tone

(a gradient of yellowish brown colours).

[Red] : Captured images will be stored in a red tone.[Green] : Captured images will be stored in a green tone.[Blue] : Captured images will be stored in a blue tone.

[Negative] : Save the image in negative mode.

 Press the OK button and then a confirmation window will display.

[Save] : The image with the effect added will be saved as a

new file with a new name.

[Cancel] : cancels the effect.





## Rotating an image

- You can rotate the stored images by various degrees. Once the playback of the rotated picture is finished, it will switch back to the original state.
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Rotate] menu tab.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button.

#### **DPOF**

- DPOF(Digital Print Order Format) allows you to embed printing information on your memory card's MISC folder. Select the pictures to be printed and how many prints to make.
- The DPOF indicator will display on the LCD monitor when an image that has DPOF information plays back. Images can then be printed on DPOF printers, or at an increasing number of photo labs.
- This function is not available for Movie clips and Voice recording files.

### **DPOF: Standard**

- This function allows you to embed print quantity information on a stored image.
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [DPOF] menu tab.
  - Select the [Standard] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

[Select]: Selection window for an image to print is displayed.

- Up/Down/Left/Right : Select an image to print.
- Zoom W/T Button : Select the number of prints.

[All Pics]: Configure number of prints for all pictures except movie and voice files.

- W/T button : Select a number of prints [Cancel] : Cancel the print setup.
- Press the OK button to confirm the setting.
   If an image carries DPOF instructions, the DPOF indicator
   ) will show.







#### **DPOF: Index**

- Images (except for movie clips and voice file) are printed as index type.
  - 1. Press the play mode button and press the menu button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [DPOF] menu tab.
  - 3. Select the [Index] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.

## **Copy To Card**

- This enables you to copy image files, movie clips and voice recording files to the memory card.

  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

- When this menu is selected without inserting a memory card, you can select the [Copy to Card] menu but the menu can't be run.
- If there is not enough space available in the memory card to copy saved images in the
  internal memory (48MB), the [Copy to Card] command will copy only some of the images
  and display [Card Full!] message. Then the system will return to the playback mode.
   Please be sure to delete any unnecessary files to free up space before inserting the
  memory card into the camera.
- When you move the images that are stored in the internal memory by doing
  [Copy to Card] to the card, the next number of file names will be created in the card to
  avoid duplication of the file name. If the last file in the memory card is SSM10010.jpg,
  the copied file names start from SSM10011.jpg. After completing [Copy to Card], the last
  stored image of the last copied folder is displayed on the LCD monitor.



# **PictBridge**

- Setting up the camera for connection with the printer
  - In any mode with the exception of Voice Recording mode, press the MENU button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select [Setup] menu tab.
  - Select [USB] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - Select [Printer] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.



- Connecting the Camera to a Printer
  - Using the USB cable with Cradle:
     Connect the camera and the cradle. Connect the cradle to a printer's USB port with the supplied USB cable.
  - Using the USB cable with Camera:
     Connect the camera to a printer's USB port with the supplied USB cable.



If you selected [Computer] in Step 4, when you connect the camera to your printer, the [Connecting Computer] message will display and the connection will not be established. In this case, disconnect the USB cable, and then follow the procedure from Step 2 and onward.





- This function allows the user to select the file naming format.
- Assigning File Names
  - In any mode with the exception of Voice Recording and MP3 mode, press the MENU button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Setup] menu tab.
  - 3. Select the [File] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.



[Reset] : After using the reset function, the next file name will be set from 0001 even after formatting, deleting all or inserting a new memory card.

#### **INFORMATION**

- The first stored folder name is 100SSCAM, and the first file name is SSM10001.
- File names are assigned sequentially from SSM10001 → SSM10002 → ~ → SSM19999.
- The folder number is assigned sequentially from 100 to 999 as follows: 100SSCAM  $\rightarrow$  101SSCAM  $\rightarrow$   $\sim$   $\rightarrow$  999SSCAM.
- The files used with the memory card conform to the DCF(Design rule for Camera File systems) format.

#### **Auto power off**

- This function switches the camera off after a set amount of time in order to prevent unnecessary battery drainage.
- Setting Power Off
  - In any mode with the exception of Voice Recording and MP3 mode, press the MENU button.
  - Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select the [Setup] menu tab.
  - Select the [Power Save] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.
    - [1, 3, 5, 10min] : The power will turn off automatically if not used for the period of time specified.
  - 5. Press the menu button twice and the menu will disappear.



- Even if the battery and AC charger are removed and inserted again, the power off setting will be preserved.

### Language

- There is a choice of languages that can be displayed on the LCD monitor. Even if the battery and AC charger are removed and inserted again, the language setting will be preserved.

### Formatting a memory card

- This is used for formatting the memory card. If you run [Format] on the memory card, all images and MP3 files, including the protected images, will be deleted. Be sure to download important files to your PC before formatting the memory card.
- Formatting a Memory Card
  - In any mode with the exception of Voice Recording and MP3 mode, press the MENU button.

  - Select the [Format] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
  - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

If [No] is selected : The memory card will not be formatted.

Press the menu button twice and the menu display will disappear.

If [Yes] is selected: A [Processing!] message appears and the memory card will be formatted. If you ran FORMAT in Play mode, a [No Image!] message will appear.

#### **INFORMATION**

- Be sure to run [Format] on the following types of memory card.
  - A new memory card, or an unformatted memory card.
  - A memory card that has a file this camera can't recognise or one that has been taken from another camera.
- Always format the memory card using this camera. If you insert a memory card that has been formatted using other cameras, memory card readers, or PCs, you will get a [Card Error!] message.



# Selecting Video out type

- NTSC : U.S.A, Canada, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Mexico.
- PAL : Australia, Austria, Belgium, China, Denmark, Finland, Germany, U.K., Holland, Italy, Kuwait, Malaysia, New Zealand, Singapore, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, Norway.
- When using a TV as an external monitor, you will need to select the external or AV channel of the TV.
- There will be a digital noise on the external monitor, but it is not a malfunction.
- If the image is not in the centre of the screen, use the TV controls to centre it.
- When the camera is connected to an external monitor, the menu will be visible on the
  external monitor and the menu functions are the same as those indicated on the LCD
  monitor.

## **Quick view**

- If you enable Quick View before capturing an image, you can view the image you just captured on the LCD monitor for the duration set in the [Quick View] setup. Quick view is possible only with still images.



### Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

#### Playlist button

- You can see the MP3 files list and select a file.
- Selecting MP3 files
  - In the MP3 mode, press the ( ) button.
     The cursor will highlight a file that had been played back at the time the list button was pressed.



You can select a file by pressing the Up/ Down button. Pressing the Left/ Right button scrolls the previous/next page of the lists.



### **INFORMATION**

- MP3 lists and playback order is the same as the order for saving files on a memory card.
- If files were not encoded with correct MP3 file format, they will not list on the Playlist, even though the files are saved with the .mp3 filename extension.
- A title coded with unsupported language is displayed as "-----".
- This camera doesn't have a Resume function. If you turn off the camera or change the camera mode while a file is playing back, the file may start from the first segment of the file the next time the track is played.
- This camera can play back an MP3 file encoded between 48 and 320Kbps bit rate.

### Important notes

Be sure to observe the following precautions!

- This unit contains precision electronic components. Do not use or store this unit in the following locations.
  - Areas exposed to severe changes in temperature and humidity.
  - Areas exposed to dust and dirt.
  - Areas exposed to direct sunlight or the inside of a vehicle in hot weather.
  - Environments where there is high magnetism or excessive vibration.
  - Areas with high explosives or highly flammable materials.
- Do not leave this camera in places subject to dust, chemicals (like naphthalene and mothball), high temperature and high humidity.
  - Keep this camera with silica gel in a hermetically sealed box when not planning to use the camera for a long period of time
- Sand can be particularly troublesome to cameras.
  - Do not let sand get inside the unit when using it on beaches, coastal dunes, or other areas where there is lots of sand.
  - Doing so may result in failure or may permanently render the unit unusable.
- Handling the camera
  - Never drop the camera or subject it to severe shocks or vibrations.
  - Prevent the large size LCD monitor from an impact. When this camera is not used, keep this camera in the camera case.
  - Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
  - This camera is not waterproof.
    - To avoid dangerous electrical shocks, never hold or operate the camera with wet hands.
  - If you use this camera in wet places, such as beach or pool, do not let water or sand get inside the camera. Doing so may result in failure or may permanently damage the unit.
- Extremes in temperature may cause problems.
  - If the camera is transferred from a cold to a warm and humid environment, condensation can form on the delicate electronic circuitry. If this occurs, turn the camera off and wait for at least 1 hour until all moisture is dispersed. Moisture build up can also occur in the memory card. If this happens, turn off the camera and remove the memory card. Wait until the moisture has dispersed.

### Important notes

- Caution on Using the Lens
  - If the lens is subjected to direct sunlight, it could result in discoloration and deterioration of the image sensor.
  - Pay attention not to get fingerprints or foreign substances on the surface of the lens.
- If the digital camera is not used for a long period, an electric discharge can occur.
  It is a good idea to remove the batteries and the memory card if you do not intend using the camera for an extended period of time.
- If the camera is exposed to an electronic interference, it will turn itself off to protect the memory card.
- Camera Maintenance
  - Use a soft brush (available from photo stores) to gently clean the lens and LCD assemblies. If this does not work, lens-cleaning paper with lens cleaning fluid can be used. Clean the camera body with a soft cloth. Do not allow this camera to come into contact with solvent materials such as benzol, insecticide, thinners etc. This may damage the body shell of the camera and also affect its performance. Rough handling can damage the LCD monitor. Take care to avoid damage and keep the camera in its protective carry case at all times when not in use.
- Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the camera.
- Under certain conditions, static electricity can cause the flash unit to fire. This is not harmful to the camera and is not a malfunction
- When images are uploaded or downloaded(when the charger and USB cable are inserted into the cradle at the same time), the data transfer may be affected by static electricity. In this case, disconnect and re-connect the USB cable before trying the transfer again.
- Before an important event or going on a trip, you should check the camera condition.
  - Take a picture for testing the camera condition and prepare extra battery.
  - Samsung cannot be held responsible for camera malfunctions.
- Do not use headphones/earphones while driving, cycling, or operating any motorized vehicle.
   It may create a traffic hazard and can be illegal in some areas.
- Avoid using headphones/earphones at high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuously loud and extended play. If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.





- Check the MAC OS. You can check the MAC OS version during MAC OS start-up. This camera is compatible with MAC OS 9.2 ~ 10.3.
- 3. Connect the camera to the Macintosh and turn the camera power on.
- 4. A new icon will be displayed on the desktop after connecting the camera to the MAC.

### **Using the USB Driver for MAC**


- 1. Double click a new icon on the desktop and the folder in the memory will be displayed.
- Select an image file and copy or move it to MAC.


- For Mac OS 10.0 or later: First complete uploading from computer to camera and then remove the removable disk with the Extract command.
- If a movie clip can't play back on the Mac OS, please visit the following site(http://www.divx.com/divx/mac/) and download the codec. Or, use a media player that supports the Xvid codec (Mplayer, VLC(VideoLAN Client) media player).

## **Digimax Master**

- You can download, view, edit and save your images and movies with this software. This software is only compatible with Windows except for the Windows 98.
- To start the program, click [Start → Programs → Samsung → Digimax Master].
- Downloading images
  - 1. Connect the camera to your PC.
  - A window for downloading images will display after connecting the camera and your PC.
    - To download the captured images, select the [Select All(A)] button.
    - Select desired folder in the window and click the [Select All(A)] button. You can save captured images and selected folder.
    - If you click the [Cancel] button, downloading will be cancelled.



3. Click [Next(N) >] button.



- Select a destination and make a folder to save downloaded images and folders.
  - Folder names can be made in order of date and images will be downloaded.
  - Folder name will be made as you want and images will be downloaded

 After selecting a folder that was made before, images will be downloaded.






6. A window will open as shown alongside. The destination of the selected folder will be displayed on the upper side of the window. Click the [Start] button to download the images.



7. Downloaded images will be displayed.




Image viewer: You can view the stored images.



- Image viewer functions are listed below.
  - ① Menu bar : You can select menus.
    - File, Edit, View, Tools, Change functions, Auto download, help, etc.
  - 2 Image selection window: You can select the desired images in this window.
  - ③ Media type selection menu : You can select image viewer, image edit and movie edit functions in this menu.
  - Preview window: You can preview a image or a movie clip and check the multi media information.
  - ⑤ Zoom bar: You can change preview size.
  - 6 Folder display window: You can see the folder location of the selected image.
  - (7) Image display window: Images of the selected folder are displayed.

• Image edit: You can edit the still image.



- Image edit functions are listed below.
  - ① Edit menu : You can select the following menus.


[Tools] : You can resize or crop the selected image. See the [Help] menu.

[Retouch]: You can change image or insert effects on the image. See the [Help] menu.

- ② Drawing tools: Tools for editing an image.
- 3 Image display window: a selected image displays in this window.
- 4 Preview window: You can preview the changed image.
- \* A still image edited with Digimax Master can't be played back on the camera.
- \* Refer to the [Help] menu in Digimax Master for further information.

Movie edit: You can get the still image, movie clip, narration, music files together in a movie clip.



- Movie clip edit functions are listed below.

① Edit menu : You can select the following menus.

[Add Media]: You can add other media elements to a movie.

[Edit Clip] : You can change the brightness, contrast, colour and saturation.

[Effects] : You can insert an effect.[Set Text] : You can insert texts.[Narrate] : You can insert a narration.

[Produce] : You can save the edited multi media as a new file name.

Frame display window : You can insert multi media in this window. You can select AVI, Windows media (wmv), Windows media (asf) and movie clip for

this camera (avi, MPEG-4) file types.

(2) Frame display window: You can insert multi media in this window.

- \*\* Some movie clips that was compressed with a codec that is not compatible with the Digimax Master can't play back in the Digimax Master.


- Select a movie for playing back on the camera by pressing the [Add] button.
   Insert effects and edit the movie. To save the edited movie, press the [Make] button.
- 2. Select [Movie for camera] video type.
- 3. Select Camera option, Output location, File name and press the [Make] button.
  - Frame size : Selecting the width and height of the frame.
  - Frame rate : Selecting the frame rate per second.
  - File location : Selecting a location where the edited movie is saved.
  - File name : To play back the movie on the camera, you must keep the DCF rule. Save
    - the movie as SSM1XXXX.avi (You can input any numbers between 0001
    - ~ 9999 instead of XXXX letters).
- Connect the camera to the computer with the included USB cable.
- Copy the edited movie to [Removable Disk\DCIM\XXXSSCAM].
   (You can input any numbers between 100 ~ 999 instead of XXX letters)
- You can play back the movie in the Play mode of the camera.






## **Digimax Reader**

- Digimax Reader is a Text recognition program. You can save an image file that is captured in the Text mode, as a text file with this program. This software is only compatible with Windows.
- To start the program, click [Start → Programs → Digimax Reader Eng]. The following screen will appear.



- How to use the Digimax Reader
  - Connect the camera and the PC with a USB cable and download the images that were stored in the camera to the PC.

  - 2. Run the Digimax Reader.
  - 3. Click the Open( 🏡 ) icon as shown alongside.
  - 4. Select the image you want to save as a text file.


5. Click the Area Analysis( ) icon to scan the image.

### **INFORMATION**

- To get an image that can be recognised as a text :
  - Keep a distance that you can capture the image clearly between the subject and the camera.
  - The subject needs to be centered.
  - Seek to avoid camera shake to get a good image.
- Refer to the [Help] menu in Digimax Reader for further information.

Please check the following if the USB connection malfunctions.

[Case 1]

The camera power is off.

→ Turn the camera power on.

[Case 2]

USB Driver is not installed correctly.

→ Install the USB Driver correctly. Refer to page 127.

[Case 3]

The USB cable is not connected or you are using a cable with an incorrect specification.

→ Use a USB cable with the correct specification.

[Case 4]

The camera is not recognized by your PC.

Sometimes, the camera may appear under [Unknown Devices] in Device Manager.

→ Install the camera driver correctly.

Turn off the camera, remove the USB cable, plug in the USB cable again, and then turn on the camera

[Case 5]

There is an unexpected error during file transfer

→ Turn the camera power off and on again. Transfer the file again.

[Case 6]

How do I know my computer supports a USB Interface?

- → Check the USB port in your computer or keyboard.
- → Check the OS version. A USB Interface is available in Windows 98, 98SE, 2000, ME\_XP.
- Check [Universal Serial Bus controllers] in Device Manager. Carry out the following checks [Universal Serial Bus controllers].

Win 98/ME : Follow [Start  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Control Panel  $\rightarrow$  System  $\rightarrow$  Device

Manager  $\rightarrow$  Universal Serial Bus controllers].

Win 2000 : Follow [Start  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Control Panel  $\rightarrow$  System  $\rightarrow$  Hardware

→ Device Manager → Universal Serial Bus controllers].

 $\mbox{Win XP} \qquad : \mbox{Follow [Start} \rightarrow \mbox{Control Panel} \rightarrow \mbox{Performance and Maintenance} \rightarrow \mbox{}$ 

 $System \rightarrow Hardware \rightarrow Device\ Manager \rightarrow Universal\ Serial\ Bus$ 

controllers].

There must be USB Host Controller and USB root hub under [Universal Serial Bus controllers].

In addition, double-click on the USB Universal Host Controller and the USB Root Hub to check if the Device Status states "This device is working properly". If the Device Status says the device is "not working properly", click the "Driver" tab and then click [Update Driver] or [Reinstall Driver].

→ When all the conditions mentioned above are met, the computer can support the USB interface.

#### [Case 7]

When using the USB hub.

There may be a problem in connecting the camera to the PC through the USB hub if the PC and the hub are not compatible. Wherever possible, connect the camera to the PC directly.

#### [Case 8]

Are other USB cables connected to the PC?

The camera may malfunction when it is connected to the PC at the same time as another USB cable. In this case, disconnect the other USB cable, and connect only one USB cable to the camera.

#### [Case 9]

When I open the Device Manager (by clicking Start  $\rightarrow$  (Settings)  $\rightarrow$  Control Panel  $\rightarrow$  (Performance and Maintenance)  $\rightarrow$  System  $\rightarrow$  (Hardware)  $\rightarrow$  Device Manager), there are 「Unknown Devices」 or 「Other Devices」 entries with a yellow question mark(?) beside them or devices with an exclamation mark(!) beside them.

- Right-click on the entry with the question(?) or exclamation (!) mark and select "Remove". Restart the PC and connect the camera the again. For Windows 98 PC, remove the camera driver also, restart the PC, and then reinstall the camera driver.
- Double-click on the entry with the question (?) or exclamation (!) mark, click the "Driver" tab, and click [Update Driver] or [Reinstall Driver]. If a message appears asking you to specify the location of the appropriate device driver, specify "USB Driver" in the CD supplied.

#### [Case 10]

In some security programs (Norton Anti Virus, V3, etc.), the computer may not recognize the camera as a removable disk.

Stop the security programs and connect the camera to the computer. Refer to the security program instructions about how to stop the program.

- When the movie clip doesn't play back on the PC
- \* When the movie clip recorded by the camera doesn't play back on the PC, the causes are mostly due to the codec installed on the PC.
- When codec for play back the movie clip isn't installed
  - → Install the codec as listed below.

#### [Installing codec for Windows]

- 1) Insert the CD provided with the camera
- Run the windows explorer and select [CD-ROM drive:\XviD] folder and click the XviD codex-1[1].1.0.exe file.

### [Installing codec for Mac OS]

- 1) Visit the following site for downloading the codec.http://www.divx.com/divx/mac
- Click the [Free Download] button located at the upper right side of the page and a window for downloading the DivX codec will display.
- 3) Select Mac OS you use and click the [Download] button. Save it on a folder you want to.
- 4) Run the downloaded file and the codec for playing back the movie clip will be installed.
  - If a movie clip can't play back on the Mac OS, use a media player that supports XviD codec (Mplayer, VideoLanClient).
- When the DirectX 9 0 or later is not installed.
  - → Install the DirectX 9.0 or later
  - 1) Insert the CD provided with the camera
  - 2) Run the windows explorer and select the [CD-ROM drive:\ USB Driver\DirectX 9.0] folder and click the DXESETUP.exe file. The DirectX will be installed. Visit the following site for downloading the DirectX.http://www.microsoft.com/directx

- If a PC (Windows 98) stops responding while the camera and PC are connected repeatedly
  - → If a PC (Windows 98) is turned on for a long time and the camera is connected repeatedly, the PC may not recognise the camera. In this case, re-start the PC.
- If a PC connected with the camera stops responding while Windows is starting.
  - → In this case, disconnect the PC and the camera and Windows will start. If the problem happens continuously, set the Legacy USB Support to disable and re-start the PC. The Legacy USB Support is in the BIOS setup menu. (The BIOS setup menu differs from the PC manufacturers and some BIOS menus don't have Legacy USB Support) If you can't change the menu by yourself, contact to the PC manufacturer or BIOS manufacturer.
- If the movie clip can't be deleted, removable disk can't be extracted or an error message displays during the file transfer.
  - → If you install only the Digimax Master, the problems mentioned above occasionally happen.
    - Close the Digimax Master program by clicking the Digimax Viewer icon on the Taskbar.
    - Install all the application programs included in the software CD.
       (You must install the Movie clip codec)



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
