

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Getting to know your camera

Thank you for buying a Samsung Digital Camera.

- Prior to using this camera, please read the user manual thoroughly.
- When you require After Sales service, please bring the camera and the cause of the camera malfunction (such as battery, Memory card etc.) to the A/S centre.
- Please check that the camera is operating properly prior to when you intend to
 use it (e.g. for a trip or an important event) to avoid disappointment. Samsung
 camera takes no responsibility for any loss or damages that may result from
 camera malfunction.
- Keep the manual in a safe place.

- Please do not use this product in close proximity to flammable or explosive gases, as this could increase the risk of explosion.
- Should any form of liquid or a foreign object enter the camera, do not use it. Switch off the camera, and then disconnect the power source. You must contact your dealer or Samsung Camera Service centre. Do not continue to use the camera as this may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not insert or drop metallic or inflammable foreign objects into the camera through access
 points e.g. the memory card slot and battery chamber. This may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not operate this camera with wet hands. This could pose a risk of electric shock.

- Do not use the flash in close proximity to people or animals. Positioning the flash too close to your subject's eyes may cause eyesight damage.
- For safety reasons keep this product and accessories out of reach of children or animals to prevent accidents e.g.:
 - Swallowing battery or small camera accessories. If an accident should occur, please consult a doctor immediately.
 - There is the possibility of injury from the camera's moving parts.
- Battery and camera may become hot during prolonged use and it may result in camera malfunction.
 Should this be the case, allow the camera to sit idle for a few minutes to allow it time to cool.
- Do not leave this camera in places subject to extremely high temperatures, such as a sealed vehicle, direct sunlight or other places of extreme variances in temperature. Exposure to extreme temperatures may adversely affect the camera's internal components and could cause a fire.
- When in use, do not cover the camera or AC Charger. This may cause heat to build up and distort the camera body or cause a fire. Always use the camera and its accessories in a well-ventilated area.

CAUTION indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in a minor or moderate injury.

- Leaking, overheating, or burst battery could result in fire or injury.
 - Use battery with the correct specification for the camera.

- Remove the battery when not planning to use the camera for a long period of time. Battery may leak corrosive electrolyte and permanently damage the camera's components.
- Do not fire the flash while it is in contact with hands or objects. Do not touch the flash after using it continuously. It may cause burns.
- Do not move the camera while it is switched on, if you are using the AC Charger. After use, always switch off the camera before unplugging the cable from the wall socket. Then make sure that any connector cords or cables to other devices are disconnected before moving the camera. Failure to do so may damage the cords or cables and cause a fire or electric shock.
- Take care not to touch the lens and where the lens cover is to avoid taking an unclear image and possibly causing camera malfunction.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Low temperatures can affect the performance of the LCD monitor and you may experience followings. This will usually recover at normal temperatures and is perfectly normal.
 - The time of power on can be delayed and the colour of LCD monitor can be changed slightly.
 - Fast moving, when you point the camera towards the subject, can make the after-image of the LCD monitor.
- Credit cards may be demagnetized if left near case. Avoid leaving magnetic strip cards near the case.

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







Connecting to a Power Source

- You should use the rechargeable battery (SLB-0837) supplied with the camera. Be sure to charge the battery before using the camera.
- Insert the battery as shown
 - If the camera does not turn on after you have inserted battery, please check whether the battery is inserted with the correct polarity (+/-).
 - To avoid damaging the camera, do not use unnecessary force while the battery chamber cover is open.

INFORMATION

- When the camera is not used, turn off the camera power.
- Low temperatures (below c) can affect the performance of the battery and you may experience reduced battery life.
- Battery will usually recover at normal temperatures.
- During extended use of the camera, the camera body may become warm.
 This is perfectly normal.

Using the AC Charger

Before turning on the camera power with an AC Charger, insert the rechargeable battery that was charged for over 10 minutes with turning off the camera. If you have access to a mains supply, using an AC Charger allows the camera to be used for long periods of time.


DANGER

- Ensure that neither the camera nor Charger comes into contact with water or metallic materials as this may cause damage to camera and AC charger.
- Please ensure that you use an AC Charger with the correct specification for the camera. Failure to do so may affect your warranty.

CAUTION

- If the charging LED of the AC Charger does not turn on or blink after inserting the rechargeable battery, please check whether the battery is inserted correctly.
- If you charge the battery with the camera power on, the battery can't charge fully. Turn the camera off while charging the battery.

- A USB cable for transmitting data can't be used for charging the rechargeable battery.
- A USB cable for recharging the battery is optional.
 - When the USB cable for recharging the battery is inserted into the connection terminal of the camera, you can charge the battery and transmit data at the same time.
 - When the USB cable for recharging the battery is inserted into the DC connection terminal of the cradle, you can charge the battery.
 When the USB cable for recharging the battery is inserted into the USB port of the cradle, you can transmit data.
- Charging time (When the camera is turned off)
 - Using the cradle: About 150MIN
 - Using the AC Charger: About 150MIN


- If you insert the fully discharged battery to charge it, do not turn on the camera at the same time. The camera may not be turned on because of the low battery capacity. Charge the battery for over 10 minutes to use the camera.
- Do not use the flash frequently or take a movie clip with the fully discharged battery charged for a short time. Even if the charger is inserted, the camera power may be turned off because the rechargeable battery is discharged again.

Instructions on how to use the memory card

- Repeated use of the memory card will eventually reduce the memory card's performance. Should this be the case, you will need to purchase a new memory card. Wear and tear on the memory card is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
- The memory card is an electronic precision device. Do not bend, drop or knock the memory card.
- Do not store the memory card in an environment with strong electronic or magnetic fields, e.g. near loud speakers or TV receivers.
- Please do not use or store in an environment where there are extremes in temperature.
- Do not allow the memory card to become dirty or to come into contact with any liquid. Should this happen, clean the memory card with a soft cloth.
- Please keep the memory card in its case when not in use.
- During and after periods of extended use, you may notice that the memory card is warm. This is perfectly normal.
- Before using a memory card from another digital camera, it must be re-formatted in this camera before use.
- If the memory card is used incorrectly, or if the power is switched off or the card is removed while recording, the existing data may become corrupted.
- Samsung cannot be held responsible for lost data.

Instructions on how to use the memory card

The camera can use SD Memory Cards and MMC (Multi Media Cards). Some cards are not compatible according to the memory card manufacturer and memory card type.



[SD (Secure Digital) memory card]

The SD memory card has a write protect switch that prevents image files from being deleted or formatted. By sliding the switch to the bottom of the SD memory card, the data will be protected.By sliding the switch to the top of the SD memory card, the data protection will be cancelled. Slide the switch to the top of the SD memory card before taking a picture. Please consult the enclosed manual for using the MMC Cards.

Inserting the memory card

- Insert the memory card as shown.
 - Turn off the camera's power before inserting the memory card.
 - Have the front of the memory card facing toward the front of the camera (lens) and the card pins toward the back of the camera (LCD monitor).
- Do not insert the memory card the wrong way round. Doing so may damage the memory card slot.

- ** The zoom buttons are not pressed during the movie clip recording. The recording times can be changed by the zoom operation.

When Using the Camera for the First Time

- When the camera is turned on for the first time, a menu will be displayed to set date, time and language in the LCD monitor. This menu will not be displayed again after setting up the date, time and language. Set up the date, time and language before using this camera.
- Setting up the date, time and date type
 - Select the [Date&Time] menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - 2. Select the desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN/ LEFT/ RIGHT button.

RIGHT button : selects YEAR/ MONTH/ DAY/

HOUR/ MINUTE/ DATE TYPE

LEFT button : Moves the cursor to the [Date&Time] main menu if the cursor is at the first item of the date and time setup. In all other instances,

the cursor will be shifted to the left of its current position.

UP/DOWN button: changes the value of each item.

- Setting up the language
 - Select the [Language] menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - Select the desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.
 When the settings are complete, press the MENU button twice to exit the menu screen.



- You can select 22 languages. These are listed below:
 - English, Korean, French, German, Spanish, Italian, S.Chinese, T.Chinese, Japanese, Russian, Portuguese, Dutch, Danish, Swedish, Finnish, Thai, BAHASA(MALAY/ INDONESIAN), Arabic, Hungarian, Czech, Polish and Turkish.
- Even if the camera is restarted, the language setting will be maintained.


Changing the recording mode

- You can select the desired working mode using the M (Mode) button located on the back of the camera and the [MODE], [MODE SET] menu. Refer to page 59 for more information about the MP3. PMP mode.
- Selecting the [MODE] menu
 - As this camera has a 45MB internal memory, you do not need to insert the memory card. If a memory card is not inserted, images will be stored in the internal memory. If a memory card is inserted, images will be stored on the memory card.



- 2. Press the menu button and a menu will display.
- 3. Use the UP/DOWN button to select the [Mode] menu.
- 4. Select [Still/ Movie/ PMP] or [Full] sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button.
 - [Still/ Movie/ PMP]: A still image mode that was selected in the [MODE SET] menu and movie clip mode can be selected.
 - [Full] : Auto, Program, Movie clip and scene modes can be selected.

- Changing the recording mode : If the [Still/ Movie/ PMP] menu was selected
 - 1. The previously used recording mode will appear in the display.
 - Press the M (Mode) button located on the back of the camera and the recording mode will change to the movie clip mode.
 - Press the M (Mode) button twice and a still image mode selected on the [MODE SET] menu will be selected.

- Changing the recording mode : If the [Full] menu was selected
 - The previously used recording mode will appear in the display.
- Press the M (Mode) button located on the back of the camera and the mode selection menu will display.
- 3. To select the Auto, Program, Movie clip, MP3, PMP or Scene modes, press the Left/ Right button. To move between the Auto, Program, Movie clip menu line and Scene menu line, press the Up/ Down button.
- 4. Press the M (Mode) button and the mode selection menu will disappear.

Starting the recording mode

- How to use the Auto mode
 - Please select this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction
 - 1. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
 - 2. Press the shutter button to capture an image.





INFORMATION

- If the auto focus frame turns to red when you press the shutter button down half way, it means that the camera cannot focus on the subject.
- How to use the Movie clip mode
 - A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time of the memory capacity allows.
 - 1. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
 - 2. Press the shutter button once and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time allows. Movie clips will still be recorded if the shutter button is released.



If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.

- * Image size and type are listed below.
- Image size : 640X480, 320X240, 160X128 (user selectable)
- Movie clip file type : AVI (MPEG-4)

- Recording the movie clip without voice You can record the movie clip without voice.
 - 1. Press the Up button and the ((1)) icon will display on the LCD monitor
 - 2. Press the shutter button and movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time without voice.
 - 3. To stop the recording, press the shutter button again.



- Pausing while recording a movie clip (Successive Recording) This camera allows you to temporarily stop recording during unwanted scenes. By using this function, you can compile your favourite scenes into a movie clip without having to create multiple movie clips.
 - 1. Press the Pause button () to pause recording.
 - 2. Press the Pause button () again to resume the recordina.
 - 3. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.

Starting the recording mode

- How to use the Program mode
 - Selecting the automatic mode will configure the camera with optimal settings. You can still manually configure all functions except the aperture value and shutter speed.
 - Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
 - 2. Press the shutter button to capture an image.



How to use the Scene modes Use the menu to easily configure the most suitable settings for a variety of shooting situations.

- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- Press the shutter button to capture an image.
 Refer to page 32 for more information about the Scene modes.



How to use the ASR (Advanced Shake Reduction) mode In poor indoor light conditions, ASR mode will help you get a good image without using flash. Some children are sensitive to flash photography, making the ASR mode a desirable alternative.

- 1. Press the ASR mode button.
- 2. Press the shutter button to capture an image.
- * Refer to page 23 for more information about the ASR function.



- How to use the VOICE RECORDING mode
 A voice recording can be recorded for as long as the memory capacity allows.
 (Max: 1 hour).
 - In any mode with the exception of Movie clip mode, select the VOICE RECORDING mode by pressing the Voice recording button twice.
 - 2. Press the shutter button to record a voice.
 - Press the shutter button once and voice is recorded for as long as the available recording time
 (Max: 1 hour) allows. Voice will still be recorded if
 - If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.
 - File type: *.wav
- Pausing while recording a voice

the shutter button is released.

Using this function, you can record your favorite voice clips into a voice recording file without having to create multiple voice recording files.

- 1. Press the Pause button () to pause recording.
- 2. Press the Pause button () again to resume the recording.
- 3. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.



[Pausing the voice recording]

INFORMATION

- A distance of 40cm between you and the camera (microphone) is the best distance to record sound.
- If the camera power is turned off while the voice recording is paused, the voice recording is cancelled.

Things to Watch Out for When Taking Pictures

 Pressing the shutter button down half way Lightly press the shutter button to confirm focus and flash battery charge. Press the shutter button all way down to take the picture.





[Lightly press the shutter button]

- The available recording time may vary depending on shooting conditions and camera settings.
- When the Flash Off or Slow synchro mode is selected in a low lighting condition. the camera shake warning indicator () may appear on the LCD monitor. In this case, support the camera on a solid surface or change the flash mode to flash shot mode.
- Backlight compensated shots: When taking an outdoor shot, avoid facing the sun, as the image may be dark because of the strong backlight. To take a picture against the sun, please use the [Backlight] in the scene shooting mode (see page 32), Fill-in flash (see page 20), Spot metering (see page 33), or Exposure compensation (see page 25).
- Under certain conditions the auto focus system may not perform as expected.
 - When photographing a subject that has little contrast.
 - If the subject is highly reflective or shiny.
 - If the subject is moving at high speed.
 - When there is strong reflected light, or when the background is very bright.
 - When the subject matter has only horizontal lines or the subject is very narrow (such as a stick or flagpole).
 - When the surroundings are dark

Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

■ The recording mode function can be set up by using the camera buttons.

POWER button

- Used for turning the camera's power on/ off.
- If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera's power will be turned off automatically to save battery life. Refer to page 54 for more information about the auto power off function.



SHUTTER button

• Used for taking an image or recording voice in the recording mode.



ZOOM W/T button

• If the menu is not displayed, this button works as the OPTICAL ZOOM or DIGITAL ZOOM button.



ZOOM W/T button

- How to use the zoom button
 - This camera has a 3X optical zoom and a 5X digital zoom function. Using both will offer a total zoom ratio of 15X
 - Press the ZOOM T button. This will zoom into
 - the subject i.e. the subject will appear nearer.
 - Press the ZOOM W button

This will zoom out from the subject i.e. the subject will appear further away.

- Digital zoom is not optical magnification but software magnification.

INFORMATION

- Images taken using the digital zoom may take a little longer for the camera to process. Allow time for this to take place.
- The digital zoom cannot be used in movie clip shots.
- If the Zoom buttons are being pressed during the Movie clip shots, the voice
- will not recorded. • You may notice a decrease in image quality when using the digital zoom.
- To view a clearer digital zoom image, press the shutter button halfway at the maximum (3X) optical zoom position and press the zoom T button again.
- The digital zoom can't be activated in the [Night], [Children], [Close up], [Text] and [Fireworks] scene modes.

- While the menu is showing, the UP button operates as a direction button. When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the UP button operates as the voice recording or voice memo button. You can add your voice-over to a stored still image. Refer to page 16 for more information about the voice recording.
- Recording a voice memo
 - 1. Press the VOICE MEMO () button. If the voice memo indicator is displayed on the LCD monitor, the setting is completed.







[Recording Voice Memo]

- 2. Press the shutter button and take a picture. The picture is stored on the memory card.
- 3. Voice memo will be recorded for ten seconds from the moment the picture is stored. In the middle of the sound recording, pressing the shutter button will stop the voice memo.

INFORMATION

• A distance of 40cm between you and the camera (microphone) is the best distance to record sound.

Macro (♥)/ Down button

While the menu is showing, the DOWN button operates as a direction button. When the menu is not showing, you can use the MACRO/ DOWN button to take macro pictures. The distance ranges are shown below. Press the Macro button until the desired macro mode indicator displays on the LCD monitor.

Focus lock


- To focus on a subject positioned outside of the centre of the viewfinder, use the focus lock function.
- Using the Focus Lock
 - 1. Frame the subject in the centre of the auto-focus frame.
 - Press the SHUTTER button halfway. When the green auto focus frame lights up, it means the camera is focused on the subject. Be careful not to press the SHUTTER button all the way down to avoid taking an unwanted picture.
 - 3. With the SHUTTER button still pressed down only halfway, move the camera to recompose your picture as desired, and then press the SHUTTER button completely to take the picture. If you release your finger from the SHUTTER button, the focus lock function will be cancelled.



- When the flash is charging, a flash mode icon (red colour) will blink on the LCD monitor.
- Using the flash frequently will reduce the life of the battery.
- Under normal operating conditions the flash will re-charge in about 4 seconds. If the battery is weak, charging time will be longer.
- During the continuous shot and movie clip mode, the flash function will not operate.
- Take photographs within the flash range.

Self-timer (💍)/ Right button

- When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, pressing the Right button makes the cursor shift to the right tab. The right button can also be used to move to a sub menu to select a different setting. When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the RIGHT button operates as the Self-timer. Metering

Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

In Play mode, you can use the buttons on the camera to conveniently set up the Play mode functions.

Play mode button

- If you have turned on the camera by pressing the POWER button, you can press the PLAY MODE button once to switch to Play mode and press it again to switch to Recording mode.
- You can turn the power on with the play mode button. The camera is turned on in play mode. Press the play mode button (Under 1 Sec.) again to turn off the camera.
- Pressing the Play mode button for over 1 Sec., you can check the recording information.



Thumbnail(■)/ Enlargement(Q) button/ Volume button()

- You can view multiple pictures, enlarge a selected picture, and crop and save a selected area of an image.
- When a movie clip, voice memo or voice recording file is playing back, you can control the volume of those files using this button.
- Thumbnail display
 - 1. While an image is displayed full screen, press the thumbnail button
 - 2. The thumbnail display will highlight the image that had been showing at the time the thumbnail mode was selected



4. To view an image separately, press the enlargement button.


- Image enlargement
 - 1. Select an image that you want to enlarge and press the enlargement button.
 - 2. Different parts of the image can be viewed by pressing the 5 function button.
 - 3. Pressing the thumbnail button will zoom back to the original full sized image.
 - You can tell whether the image displayed is an enlarged view by checking the image enlargement indicator shown at the bottom left of the LCD monitor. (If the image is not an enlarged view, the indicator will not be displayed.) You can also check the area of enlargement.

Thumbnail(\text{ Inlargement(\text{ Q}) button/ Volume button(\frac{1}{2})

- Trimming: You can extract part of the image and save it separately.
 - 1. Select an image that you want to enlarge and press the enlargement button.
 - 2. Different parts of the image can be viewed by pressing the 5 function button
 - 3. Press the MENU button and a message will be displayed as shown alongside.



[Yes] : The trimmed image will save as a new file name, and display on the I CD monitor

: The trimming menu will disappear. [No]

- * If there is insufficient memory space to save the trimmed image, the image can't be trimmed
- * To delete the enlarged image during the trimming function, press the delete button
- Volume control: When a movie clip, voice memo or voice recording file is playing back, you can control the volume using this button

Voice () memo/ Up button

- When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, the UP button operates as a direction button
- When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the UP button operates as the voice memo button. You can add your voice to a stored still image.
- Adding a Voice Memo to a Still Image
 - 1. Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button to select an image that you wish to add sound to.
 - 2. Press the voice memo button (**l**) and the voice memo indicator will display. The camera is now ready to record a voice memo
 - 3. Press the shutter button to start recording and voice will be recorded to the still image for 10 seconds. While the voice is recording, the recording status window will be displayed as shown alongside. The recording can be stopped by pressing the shutter button again.
 - 4. The () icon will be displayed on the LCD monitor after voice memo recording has finished.
 - The voice memo will be saved in * .way format, but has the same file name as the still image to which it corresponds.
 - If you add a new voice memo to the still image that already has a voice memo, the existing voice memo will be erased.







Play & Pause (☑)/ Down button

- In Play mode, the play & pause/ down button works as follows:
 - If the menu is displayed

Press the DOWN button to move from the main menu to a sub menu, or to move down the sub menu cursor.

If a still image with a voice memo, a voice file, or a movie clip is playing
 In Stop mode: Plays a still image with a voice memo, a voice file, or a movie clip.
 During playback: Temporarily stops playback.

In Pause mode: Resumes playback

Left/ Right/ Menu/ OK button

- LEFT/ RIGHT/ MENU/ OK buttons activate the following.
 - LEFT button : While the menu is showing, the LEFT button operates as a direction button. While the menu is not showing, press the

LEFT button to select the previous image.

- RIGHT button : While the menu is showing, the RIGHT button operates as a direction button. While the menu is not showing, press the

RIGHT button to select the next image.

- MENU button : When you press the MENU button, the play mode menu will be displayed on the LCD monitor. Pressing it again will return

the LCD to the initial display.

: When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, the OK

button is used for confirming data that is changed by using

the 5 function button.

E (Effect) button

Colour

- By using the camera's digital processor, it is possible to add special effects to your images.
 - 1. Select a still image or movie clip and press the
 - button.
 - 2. Select a desired sub menu and press the OK button.
 - : Captured images will be stored in black and white.
 - : Captured images will be stored in a sepia tone.
 - : Captured images will be stored in a red tone.
 - Captured images will be stored in a green tone.
 - : Captured images will be stored in a blue tone.
 - Save the image in negative mode.



Red eye reduction

- When a shot with "red eye" is played back, pressing this button can remove the red eye from the subject.
 - Select a still image. Press the E button and select the menu.
 - **ON**: The red-eye effect is removed automatically.



- OK button

Delete (恰) button

- This deletes images stored on the memory card.
 - Select an image that you want to delete by pressing the LEFT/ RIGHT button and press the DELETE(恰) button.





Select the submenu values by pressing the Left/ Right button and then press the OK button.

If [Yes] is selected: deletes the selected images.

If [No] is selected : cancels "Delete Image".

- Printer (🖺) button

If the [USB] menu is set to the [Computer], you cannot connect a Pictbridge compatible printer to the camera through USB cable with [Connecting Computer] message. By pressing the Printer button, at this point, you can connect the easy printing mode with [Connecting Printer] message.



- * In some instances the camera may not connect to the printer, this will depend on the make of the printer.
- After the connection, the Easy printing menu will display on the LCD monitor. To display the PictBridge menu, press the Menu button.
 For more information about the PictBridge menu, refer to page 49.



PLAY mode functions can be changed by using the LCD monitor. In the PLAY mode, pressing the MENU button displays the menu on the LCD monitor. The menus you can set up in Play mode are as follows. To capture an image after setting up the play menu, press the PLAY mode button or shutter button.

Starting the slide show

- Images can be displayed continuously at pre-set intervals. You can view the slide show by connecting the camera to an external monitor.
 - Select the [Start] sub menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - 2. Use the Up/Down buttons to select the desired sub menu.

[Play] selected:

The slide show is closed after one cycle. [Repeat Play] selected :

The slide show is repeated until cancelled.

- 3. Press the OK button to start the slide show.
 - Press the Pause button to pause the slide show.
 - Press the Pause button () again to resume the slide show.
 - To stop the slide show, press the play & pause button, and then press the LEFT or RIGHT button

- Zoom W/T Button : Protect/ release the images
- OK Button : Your changes will be saved and the menu will disappear.
- If you protect an image, the protect icon will be displayed on the LCD monitor.
- (An unprotected image has no indicator)
- An image in LOCK mode will be protected from the delete function, but will NOT be protected from the format function.









Deleting images

- Of all the files stored in the memory card, the unprotected files in the DCIM subfolder will be deleted. Remember that this will permanently delete unprotected images. Important shots should be stored on a computer before deletion takes place. The startup image and SKIN image are stored in the camera's internal memory (i.e., not on the memory card) and it will not be deleted even if you delete all files on the memory card.
- Deleting images
 - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button. [Select]: Selection window for an image to delete is displayed.
 - Up/ Down/ Left/ Right : Select an image
 - Zoom T Button : Select the image for deletion. (V mark)
 - OK Button: Press the OK Button to display the confirmation message. Select the [Yes] menu and press the OK button to delete marked images.
 - [All Pics]: Displays confirmation window. Select the [Yes] menu and press the OK button to delete all unprotected images. If there aren't protected images, all the images are deleted and a [No Image!] message will display.
 - 2. After deletion, the screen will be changed to the play mode screen.







Resize

- Change the resolution (size) of pictures taken. Select [User image] to save an image to be the start-up image. The resized image will have a new file name.
 - 1. Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.

INFORMATION

- You can change the resolution of only those files compressed in the JPEG 4:2:2 format
- The resized image will have a new file name. The [Start Image, MP3 Skin] image is stored not on the memory card but on the internal memory.
- Only two [Start Image, MP3 Skin] images can be saved. If you save a new [Start Image, MP3 Skin] image, the existing startup image will be deleted in order
- If the memory capacity is insufficient to store the resized image, a [Memory Full!] message will display on the LCD monitor and the resized image will not be stored

Rotating an image

- You can rotate the stored images by various degrees. Once the playback of the rotated picture is finished, it will switch back to the original state.

- The DPOF indicator will display on the LCD monitor when an image that has DPOF information plays back. Images can then be printed on DPOF printers, or at an increasing number of photo labs.
- This function is not available for Movie clips and Voice recording files.
- If a memory card is not inserted, the menus are still displayed in the LCD, but are not selectable

DPOF: STANDARD

- This function allows you to embed print quantity information on a stored image.
 - Select the [Standard] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/DOWN button.

[Select]: Selection window for an image to print is displayed.

- Up/ Down/ Left/ Right : Select an image to print.
- Zoom W/T Button: Select the number of prints.

[All Pics]: Configure number of prints for all pictures except movie and voice files.

- W/T button : Select a number of prints
 [Cancel] : Cancel the print setup.







DPOF : Index

- Images (except for movie clips and voice file) are printed as index type.
 - Select the [Index] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button.

If [No] is selected: Cancel the index print setting.

If [Yes] is selected: The image will be printed in index format.





DPOF: Print size

- You can specify the print size when printing images stored on the memory card. The [Size] menu is available only for DPOF 1.1 compatible printers.
- Setting the Print Size
 - 1. Select the [Size] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - 2. Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button. [Select]: Selection window for an image to be changed printed size is displayed.
 - Up/ Down/ Left/ Right : Select an image.
 - Zoom W/T Button: Change the print size.
 - OK button: Your changes will be saved and the menu will disappear.

[All Pics]: Change print size of all saved images.

- W/T button: Select a print size
- OK button: Confirm the changed setting. [Cancel]: Cancel all of the print size settings.
- * DPOF [Size] secondary menu: Cancel, 3X5, 4X6, 5X7.8X10
- * Depending on the manufacturer and print model, cancelling the printing may take a little longer for the printer to process.







On Screen Display information

- You can check shooting information about the displayed image.
 - 1. Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.










Copy To Card

- This enables you to copy image files, movie clips and voice recording files on the camera's built-in internal memory to the camera's removable SD memory card.
- Copying to the Memory Card
 - 1. Select a desired sub menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.
 - [No] : Cancels "Copy to Card".
 - [Yes] : All images, movie clips and voice recording files saved in the internal memory are copied to the memory card





INFORMATION

- When this menu is selected without inserting a memory card, you can select the [COPY TO CARD] menu but the menu can't be run.
- If there is not enough space available in the memory card to copy saved images in the internal memory (45MB), the [COPY TO CARD] command will copy only some of the images and display [Memory Full!] message. Then the system will return to the playback mode. Please be sure to delete any unnecessary files to free up space before inserting the memory card into the camera.
- When you move images from the internal memory to the removable SD card, they will be automatically renumbered to avoid duplication of the file name. If the last file in the memory card is SSL20010.jpg, the copied file names start from SSL20011.jpg. After completing [COPY TO CARD], the last stored image of the last copied folder is displayed on the LCD monitor.

PictBridge

- You can use the USB cable to connect this camera to a printer that supports PictBridge (sold separately) and print the stored images directly. Movie clips and voice files cannot be printed.
- Setting up the camera for connection with the printer
 - 1. In any mode with the exception of Voice Recording mode, press the MENU button.
 - 2. Press the LEFT/ RIGHT button and select [SETUP] menu tab.
 - 3. Select [USB] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the RIGHT button.
 - 4. Select [Printer] menu by pressing the UP/ DOWN button and press the OK button.
- Connecting the Camera to a Printer
 - Using the USB cable with Cradle : Connect the camera and the cradle.

Connect the cradle to a printer's USB port with the supplied USB cable.

• Using the USB cable with Camera: Connect the camera to a printer's USB port with the supplied USB cable.











PictBridge: Picture Selection

If the [USB] menu is set to the [Computer], you cannot connect a Pictbridge compatible printer to the camera through USB cable with [Connecting Computer] message. By pressing the Printer button, at this point, you can connect the easy printing mode with [Connecting Printer] message. In some instances the camera may not connect to the printer, this will depend on the make of the printer.

■ Easy printing

When you connect the camera to printer in the Play back mode, you can print a picture easily.

- Pressing the Printer () button:
 The currently displayed image will be printed with the printer's default setting.
- Pressing the Left/ Right button : Selects a previous/ next image.



- Select pictures to print
 - 1 Press the Menu button
 - 2. The [Images] menu will appear.
 - Use the UP and DOWN buttons to select the desired submenu value, and then press the OK button.
 When [One Pic] is selected:

The PictBridge function will be applied only to the picture currently displayed.

When [All Pics] is selected:

The PictBridge function will be applied to all pictures, excluding movie clips and voice files.



- Setting the Number of Copies to Print
 - Select [One Pic] or [All Pics]. A screen where you can set the number of copies to print will appear as shown below.



■ This function allows the user to select the file naming format.

[Series]: New files are named using numbers that follow the previous sequence, even when a new memory card is used, or after formatting. or after deleting all pictures.



[Reset] : After using the reset function, the next file name will be set from 0001 even after formatting, deleting all or inserting a new memory card.

INFORMATION

- The first stored folder name is 100SSCAM, and the first file name is SSL20001.
- \bullet File names are assigned sequentially from SSL20001 \rightarrow SSL20002 \rightarrow \sim \rightarrow SSL29999

Auto power off

This function switches the camera off after a set amount of time in order to prevent unnecessary battery drainage.

[1, 3, 5, 10min]: The power will turn off automatically if not used for the period of time specified.



INFORMATION

- Even if the battery and AC charger are removed and inserted again, the power off setting will be preserved.

If [Yes] is selected : A [Processing!] message

INFORMATION



 - Do not let sand get inside the unit when using it on beaches, coastal dunes, or other areas where there is lots of sand.
 - Doing so may result in failure or may permanently render the unit unusable.
- Handling the camera
 - Never drop the camera or subject it to severe shocks or vibrations.
 - Protect the large size LCD monitor from impact. When this camera is not used, keep this camera in the camera case.
 - Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.

Important notes

If this occurs, turn the camera off and wait for at least 1 hour until all moisture is dispersed. Moisture build up can also occur in the memory card. - Caution on Using the Lens
 - If the lens is subjected to direct sunlight, it could result in discoloration and deterioration of the image sensor.
 - Don't get fingerprints or foreign substances on the surface of the lens.
- If the digital camera is not used for a long period, an electric discharge can occur.
 It is a good idea to remove the batteries and the memory card if you do not intend using the camera for an extended period of time.
- If the camera is exposed to an electronic interference, it will turn itself off to protect the memory card.
- Camera Maintenance
 - Use a soft brush (available from photo stores) to gently clean the lens and LCD assemblies. If this does not work, lens-cleaning paper with lens cleaning fluid can be used. Clean the camera body with a soft cloth. Do not allow this camera to come into contact with solvent materials such as benzol, insecticide, thinners etc. This may damage the body shell of the camera and also affect its performance. Rough handling can damage the LCD monitor. Take care to avoid damage and keep the camera in its protective carry case at all times when not in use.

- Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the camera.
- Under certain conditions, static electricity can cause the flash unit to fire.
 This is not harmful to the camera and is not a malfunction.
- When images are uploaded or downloaded (when the charger and USB cable are inserted into the cradle at the same time), the data transfer may be affected by static electricity. In this case, disconnect and re-connect the USB cable before trying the transfer again.
- Before an important event or going on a trip, you should check the camera condition.
 - Take a picture to test the camera and always carry a spare fully charged battery.
 - Samsung cannot be held responsible for camera malfunctions.
- Do not use headphones/earphones while driving, cycling, or operating any motorized vehicle. It may create a traffic hazard and can be illegal in some areas.
- Avoid using headphones/earphones at high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuously loud and extended play. If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.
