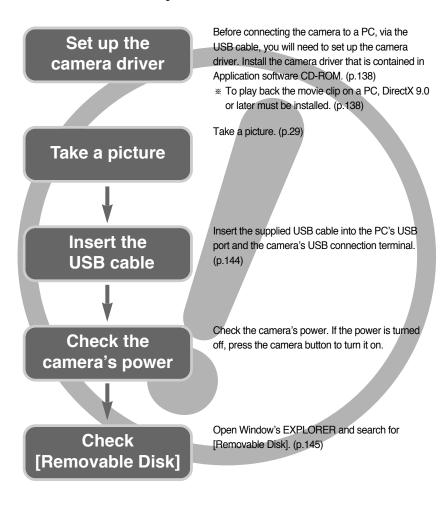

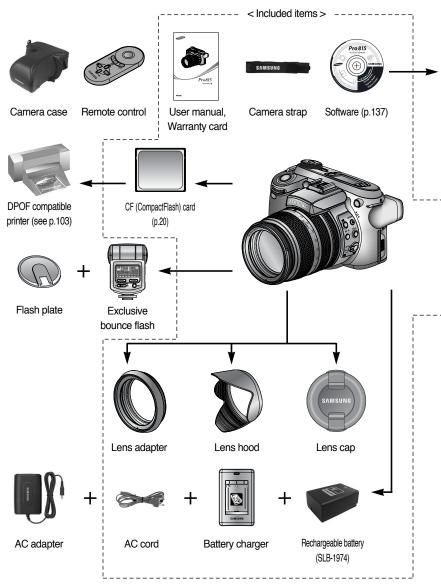

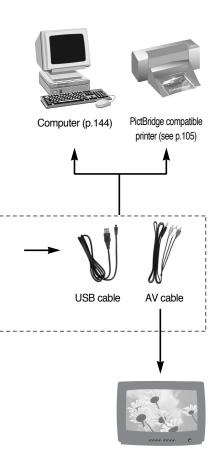

- The Lens is attached to the camera body. Do not drop or press the lens by force. It may cause a camera malfunction.
- Do not pull the lens by hand or do not rotate the zoom ring quickly. It may cause a camera malfunction. Please be careful when using the lens.

Connecting to a Power Source

- There are two ways in which to provide the camera with power. You can use battery or alternatively, you can use the AC adaptor.

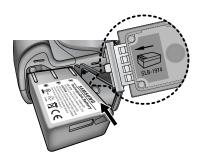

Using the battery

: If the camera does not turn on after you have inserted battery, please check whether the battery is inserted with the correct polarity (+/-).



 Turn the battery chamber lock in the direction of the arrow (OPEN) and open the battery chamber cover.

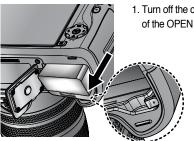


2. Insert the battery taking note of the polarity (+/-).



Close the battery chamber cover and turn the battery chamber lock in the direction of the arrow (CLOSE).

Removing the battery



- Turn off the camera. Turn the battery chamber lock in the direction of the OPEN mark and open the battery chamber cover.
 - 2. Move the battery holder aside and the battery will be released.
 - Take out the battery and close the battery chamber cover. Turn the battery chamber lock in the direction of the CLOSE mark.
- There are 4 indicators for battery condition that are displayed on the LCD monitor.

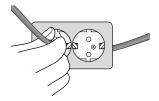

INFORMATION

Important information about battery usage.

- When the camera is not used, turn off the camera power.
- Please remove the battery if the camera will not be used for long periods.
 The battery can lose power over time and are prone to leaking if kept inside the camera.
- Low temperatures (below 0°C) can affect the performance of the battery and you may
 experience reduced battery life.
- The battery will usually recover at normal temperatures.
- During extended use of the camera, the camera body may become warm.
 This is perfectly normal.
- If the battery has low capacity, the camera power will not be turned on.
 In this case, change the battery with a new one.

- How to charge the rechargeable battery
 - 1. Plug the AC cord's power plug into the wall outlet and insert the AC cord into the charger.





2. Place the battery in the charger as shown.





- If the charging LED doesn't blink as red or blinks as yellow, please check whether the battery is inserted with the correct polarity (+/-).
- * Check the battery charging status with the Charging LED of the charger.

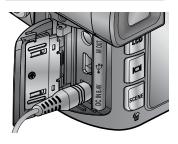
- The proper operating temperature of the charger is 0°C ~ 40°C. When you charge the
 battery under/over the proper operating temperature, the charger may not operate
 (Yellow LED is on). Charging will restart at the operating temperature and this is not
 camera malfunction.
- Samsung warrants the charger for a period of one year and the Lithium lon battery for a
 period of six months from the original date of purchase of the product.
- Wear and tear on the lithium battery is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
 If the battery duration shortens considerably, you should purchase a new battery.



Slide the switch as you please to indicate something like flash charging status.

This switch has yellow and black mark.

AC adapter (SAC-81, DC 8.4V)



If you have access to a mains supply, using an AC Adapter (SAC-81, DC 8.4V) allows the camera to be used for long periods of time.

Remove the battery from the camera when using an AC adapter. Plug the adapter into the DC-IN port on the camera before using an AC adaptor.

DANGER

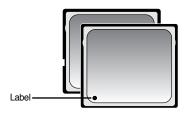
- Always turn off the power before taking the AC adapter out of the mains supply.
- As with all mains powered devices, safety is important. Ensure that neither the camera nor adapter comes into contact with water or metallic materials.
- Please ensure that you use an AC adapter (SAC-81, DC 8.4V) with the correct specification for the camera. Failure to do so may affect your warranty.

Instructions on how to use the memory card

- Be sure to format the memory card (see p.116) if you are using a newly purchased memory for the first time, if it contains data that the camera cannot recognise, or if it contains images captured with a different camera.
- Turn off the camera power whenever the memory card is being inserted or removed.
- Repeated use of the memory card will eventually reduce the memory card's performance.
 Should this be the case, you will need to purchase a new memory card. Wear and tear on the memory card is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
- The memory card is an electronic precision device.
 Do not bend, drop or subject the memory card to any heavy impact.
- Do not store the memory card in an environment with strong electronic or magnetic fields,
 e.g. near loud speakers or TV receivers.
- Please do not use or store in an environment where there are extremes in temperature.
- Please keep the memory card in its case when not in use.
- During and after periods of extended use, you may notice that the memory card is warm.
 This is perfectly normal.
- Do not use a memory card that is used in another digital camera.
 To use the memory card in this camera, first format the memory card by using the camera.
- Do not use a memory card formatted by another digital camera or memory card reader.
- If the memory card is subjected to any of the following, the recorded data may become corrupted:
 - When the memory card is used incorrectly.
 - If the power is switched off or the memory card is removed while recording, deleting/ formattting or reading.
- Samsung cannot be held responsible for lost data.
- It is advisable to copy important data onto other media as back-up e.g. floppy disks, hard disks, CD etc.
- If there is insufficient memory available
 - : A [Card Full!] message will appear and the camera will not operate. To optimise the amount of memory in the camera, replace the memory card or delete unnecessary images stored on the memory.
- If you use a low writing speed memory card, the movie clip may be stopped while recording.
 We recommend a high writing speed memory card (over 40X writing speed).

INFORMATION

- When the memory card slot cover opens, the camera can't be turned on by pressing the power button.
- Don't remove the memory card when the Card in use lamp is blinking as this may cause damage to data in the memory card.
- If the memory card slot cover is opened while data is being saved, a warning alarm sounds and the camera power is turned off after saving the data.
- The camera can use CF (CompactFlash) I and II type card.



Some CF I and II type cards are not compatible with this camera. We recommend a same kind of CF I and II type card provided with this camera.

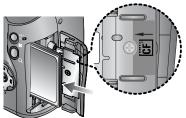

Inserting the memory card

 Ensure the camera is off and pull the memory card slot cover in the direction of the arrow to open.



2. Insert the memory card as shown on the memory slot cover.



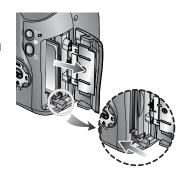
To close, push the memory card slot cover until you hear a click.

If the memory card does not slide in smoothly, do not attempt to insert it by force. Check the direction of insertion, and then insert it correctly. Do not insert the memory card the wrong way round. Doing so may damage the memory card slot.



Removing the memory card

- Turn off the camera power by using the power button. Open the memory card slot cover.
 Press the memory card eject lever and the lever will pop up. Press the lever again and then the memory card will be released.
- 2. Remove the memory card and close the memory card slot cover.



Attaching the strap

1. Thread the strap through the strap eyelet on the camera as shown alongside.



2. Thread the strap back through the strap ring as shown alongside.





3. Fasten the strap as shown.



4. Repeat steps $1 \sim 3$ to attach the other end of the strap to the other eyelet.

Attaching the lens hood

- When you shoot in direct or bright lighting conditions, the image quality may be deteriorated caused by unnecessary light. In this case, use the lens hood.
- Attach the lens adapter to the camera by turning the lens adapter clockwise as shown alongside.



2. Attach the lens hood by turning it clockwise.

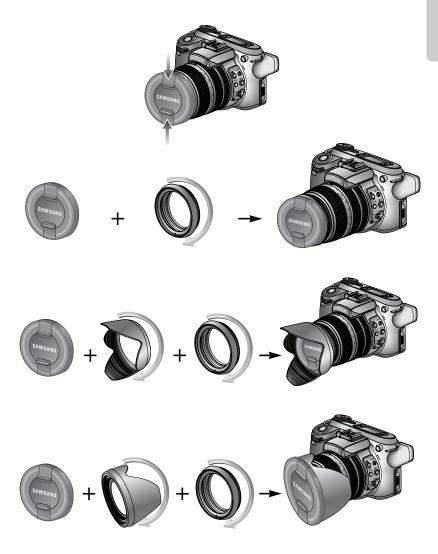

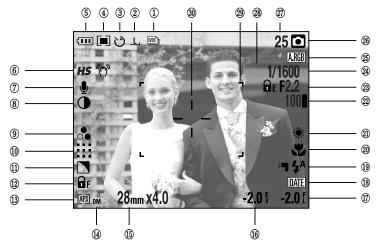
Attaching the lens cap

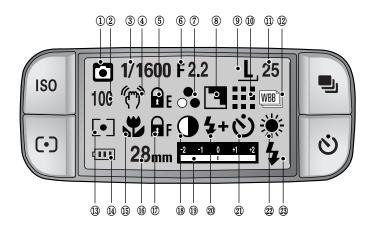

Recording mode

■ How to use the AUTO (AUTO) mode

Please select this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction.

- 1. Insert the battery and memory card. (p.16, 22).
- Press the power button to turn on the camera. (Date & Time will display for about 3 Sec. and disappear.)
- 3. Select the AUTO mode by rotating the mode dial.
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD.
- 5. Press the shutter button to capture an image.





[AUTO mode]

INFORMATION

If the auto focus frame turns to red when you press the shutter button down half way, it
means that the camera cannot focus on the subject. Should this be the case, the camera
is unable to capture an image clearly.

■ How to use the PROGRAM mode (**P**)

Selecting the program mode will configure the camera with optimal settings. You can still manually configure all functions except the aperture value and shutter speed. Step 1~2 are the same as those for AUTO mode.

- 3. Select the PROGRAM mode by rotating the mode dial.
- 4. Press the menu button to configure advanced functions (p.67).
- 5. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD.
- 6. Press the shutter button to capture an image.





[PROGRAM mode]

■ How to use the APERTURE PRIORITY mode (🔼)



This mode will set the aperture value for automatic exposure depends on the brightness of the object by automatic shutter speed setting in the camera. Steps 1~2 are the same as those for AUTO mode.

- 3. Select the APERTURE PRIORITY mode by rotating the mode dial.
- 4. Select the desired aperture value by rotating the Rear jog dial (JOG2).
- 5. Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD.
- Press the shutter button to capture an image.
- * Smaller Aperture values make the object sharp but blur the background. Larger Aperture values make both the object and background sharp.

■ How to use the SHUTTER PRIORITY mode (S)

This mode will set the shutter speed for automatic exposure depends on the brightness of the object by automatic aperture value setting in the camera.

Steps 1~2 are the same as those for AUTO mode.

- Select the SHUTTER PRIORITY mode by rotating the mode dial.
- Select the desired shutter speed by rotating the Front jog dial (JOG1).
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose image by using the LCD.
- 6. Press the shutter button to capture an image.
- * High Shutter speeds can capture a moving object in a still image as if the object is not moving. Low Shutter speeds can capture a moving object with an 'active' effect.

■ How to use the MANUAL mode (M)

The user can manually set both the aperture value and the shutter speed.

Steps 1~2 are the same as those for AUTO mode.

- 3. Select the MANUAL mode by rotating the mode dial.
- 4. Select the desired shutter speed or aperture value by rotating a jog dial.
 - Front jog dial (JOG1) : Selecting the shutter speed
 - Rear jog dial (JOG2): Selecting the aperture value
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD.
- 6. Press the shutter button to capture an image.

■ How to use the MySET mode (My)

This mode allows users to save frequently used shooting settings for later use.

Steps 1~2 are the same as those for AUTO mode.

- 3. Select the MvSET mode by rotating the mode dial.
- 4. Press the menu button and select the $[M_V]^1$ menu tab.
- Press the Right button and select the [Load Myset] menu by pressing the Up/ Down button.
- 6. Press the Right button and select a desired MySET number by pressing the Up/ Down button.
- 7. Press the OK button and a confirmation window will display. Select the [Yes] menu and press the OK button to load the camera configuration saved in the MySET number and close the menu screen.

Things to Watch Out for When Taking Pictures

- Pressing the shutter button down half way.
 Lightly press the shutter button to confirm focus and flash battery charge (p.14).
 - When the green auto focus frame lights up, it means the camera is focused on the subject and a beep will sound.
 - When the flash is charged, the flash status lamp (Red) will illuminate. Press the shutter button all way down to take the picture.

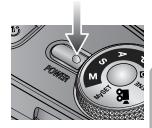
- The available recording time may vary depending on shooting conditions and camera settings.
- When the Flash Off or Slow synchro mode is selected in low lighting conditions, the camera shake warning indicator () may appear on the LCD. In this case, use a tripod, support the camera on a solid surface or change the flash mode to flash shot mode.
- Compensate for shooting into light: It is advisable not to take pictures into direct sunlight as this can make the foreground very dark. However, should your desired shot require this please use the [Backlight] from the scene shooting mode (see page 65), fill-in flash (see page 59), spot metering (see page 43), or exposure compensation (see page 50).
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Using the Rear LCD extensively will drain the battery.
 We recommend turning off the Rear LCD and using the Finder LCD and Top LCD as often as possible in order to extend battery life.
- Under certain conditions the auto focus system may not perform as expected, for example;
 - When photographing a subject that has little contrast.
 - If the subject is highly reflective or shiny.
 - If the subject is moving at high speed.
 - When there is strong reflected light, or when the background is very bright.
 - When the subject matter has only horizontal lines or the subject is very narrow (such as a stick or flagpole).
 - When the surroundings are very dark.
- If the camera is not turned off by the Power button, the changed menu settings may not be saved.
- If there is no operation during the specified time, the LCD will be turned off automatically to save battery life. Refer to the [LCD Off] menu (p.114) for more information.

Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

■ The RECORDING (AUTO, PROGRAM, APERTURE PRIORITY, SHUTTER PRIORITY, MANUAL, MySET, MOVIE CLIP, SCENE) mode can be set up by using the camera buttons.

POWER button

- Used for turning the camera's power on or off.
- If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera's power will be turned off automatically to save battery life. Refer to page 113 for more information about the auto power off function.



SHUTTER button

 In MOVIE CLIP mode: Pressing the shutter button down fully starts the process for recording a movie clip.
 Press the shutter button once and the movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time in the memory allows. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.



- In STILL IMAGE mode
 - Pressing the shutter button down halfway activates the auto focus and checks the settings of the flash.
 - Pressing the shutter button down fully takes the image and stores the relevant data regarding the shot. If you select voice memo recording, the recording will start after the camera has finished storing the image data.

Jog dial (Front, Rear)

- Used for selecting a desired value.
- Used for moving Up/ Down/ Left/ Right in a menu.





Drive button



You can select various shooting modes.

- Drive mode
 - Single shooting (): Takes one picture only.
 - Continuous shooting (): Images will be taken continuously until the shutter button is released.
 - High speed continuous shooting (H)): This takes 2.5 shots per second when the shutter is pressed down and held.
 - Ultra High speed continuous shooting (): This takes 10 shots per second, when the shutter is pressed down and held. After completing the continuous shooting, images are saved and the images play back on the Rear LCD. The maximum number of shots is 30 and the image size is fixed as 1024X768 (\$1_1).
 - Auto Exposure Bracket (AB): Use this menu if it is hard to decide exposure of the object.
 The camera will take 3 or 5 shots with settings at, below and above the set exposure.
 - Auto Focus Bracket (ABB) : Use this menu if it is hard to decide distance of the object.
 The camera will take 3 or 5 shots at different focal points.
 - White Balance Bracket (WBB)): Use this menu if it is hard to decide white balance of the object.
 The camera will take 3 or 5 shots at different white balance settings.
 - Interval shooting (): You can set predetermined intervals for the camera to take pictures over a period of time.

INFORMATION

- If you change the camera mode, a drive mode set in the Scene mode is changed to single shooting automatically.
- When you select RAW or TIFF file format, you can't select Continuous shooting, Bracket shooting, Interval shooting.

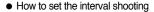

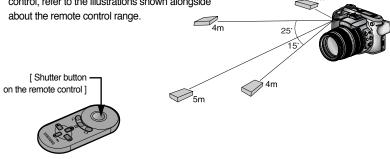

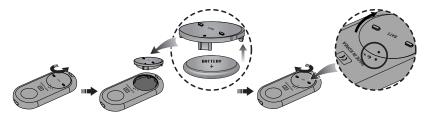

ISO button



You can select the ISO sensitivity when taking pictures.

The speed or specific light-sensitivity of a camera is rated by ISO numbers.

ISO

- AUTO (AUTO):

The camera's sensitivity is automatically changed by variables such as lighting value or subject brightness.

-50, 100, 200, 400:

You can increase the shutter speed while the same amount of light is present, by increasing the ISO sensitivity. However, the image may be saturated in high luminance. The higher the ISO value, the higher the camera's sensitivity to light is and therefore the greater its capacity to take pictures in dark conditions. However, the noise level in the image will increase as the ISO value increases, making the image appear coarse.

■ How to set the ISO

- 1. Press the ISO button and an ISO icon will display on the LCD.
- 2. Select a desired icon by rotating the Rear jog dial (JOG2).
- 3. Press the OK button to set the setting.

Metering button



 If you cannot obtain suitable exposure conditions, you can change the metering method to take better pictures.

- Metering methods
 - Multi metering ():
 Exposure will be calculated based on each parts of the LCD divided into several parts.
 This is suitable for general use.
 - CWA (Centre Weighted Average) metering ([•]):

 Exposure will be calculated based on an average of the available light in the image area.

 However, the calculation will be biased towards the centre of the image area.

 This is suitable for taking a picture of small object like a flower or insects.
 - Spot metering ():
 Only the cross marked area in the centre of the LCD will be metered for light.
 This is suitable when the subject in the centre is exposed correctly, regardless of the back lighting.
- * The + mark will be displayed when spot metering has been selected.
- How to set the metering mode
 - 1. Press the metering button and a metering icon will display on the LCD.
 - 2. Select a desired icon by rotating the Rear jog dial (JOG2).
 - Press the OK button to set the setting.

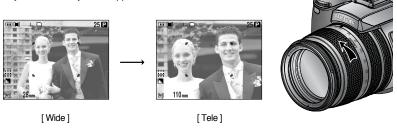

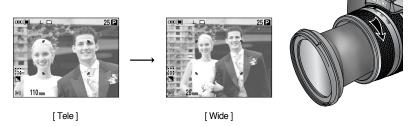

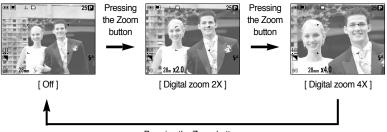

 Allow time for this to take place.
- The digital zoom cannot be used in RAW, TIFF and movie clip shots.
- You may notice a decrease in image quality when using the digital zoom.
- The higher optical and digital zoom, the more camera shake can be take place. If the focal length is over 200mm, the camera shake warning indicator will display.
 When you select a higher optical or digital zoom, we recommend using the Finder LCD and the tripod.
- Take care not to press the lens as this may cause a camera malfunction.
- Do not pull the lens by hand and do not rotate the zoom ring quickly.
 It may cause a camera malfunction. Please be careful when using the lens.

Focusing

 You can select the proper focus mode by switching the focus switch.



- AF-A: Changing the focus frame ([])
 You can change the focus frame size and position according to the subject size and position by pressing the AF-A button. This function is available in the AF-S, AF-C mode.
 - Wide AF: This is useful when taking wide range of frame.
 - Fixed spot AF: The frame (White) will be fixed at the centre of the LCD.
 - Modifying the Spot AF position: The frame will be yellowed and blink. The frame position can be changed its position.
 - Setting the Spot AF position: The frame turns yellow and the frame position will be set.



Focusing

AF-L : Focus lock

To focus on the subject positioned outside of the centre, use this button. This function is available in the AF-S mode.

- How to use the focus lock
- 1. Ensure the subject is in the centre of the auto focus frame.
- Press the AF-L button. The frame turns green and Focus lock icon () will display.
 It means the camera is focused on the subject.
- Recompose the picture and press the shutter button.After taking an image, the Focus lock function will be cancelled.
- * This function will not be available in the [Children] and [Close-up] scene mode.

AF-S : Single Auto Focus





This is suitable for taking a still image. Whenever the shutter button is pressed, the camera is focused on the subject automatically.

AF-C : Continuous Auto Focus

This is suitable for taking moving subject. The camera keeps focusing the subject when the shutter button is pressed halfway down.

- ** Note that using the Continuous Auto Focus uses more battery than the Single Auto Focus.
- * This function will not be available in the Auto recording mode and Scene mode except for the [Children] and [Close-up] scene mode.

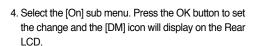

This camera automatically adjusts the exposure according to the ambient lighting conditions.

You can also select the exposure value by using the EVC (Exposure Value Compensation) ring.

This function is available in the PROGRAM, APERTURE PRIORITY, SHUTTER PRIORITY, SCENE, MySET, MOVIE CLIP mode.

This camera automatically adjusts the exposure according to the ambient lighting conditions. You can change the exposure value manually by using the AE-L (Auto Exposure Lock) button in a lighting situation where there are exposure differences between a subject and background.



- How to set the Exposure Value Compensation
 - 1. Ensure the subject is in the centre of the auto focus frame.
 - 2. Move the focus frame to a subject that has the desired exposure value.
 - Press the AE-L button and the exposure value will be fixed. An exposure lock icon (☐E) will display on the LCD.
 - Recompose the picture and press the shutter button. After taking an image, the Focus lock function will be cancelled.



5-function button

- The 5 function button activates the following;
 - Up button: While the menu is showing, press the Up button to move up the cursor up the sub menu. When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the UP button operates as the white balance button.
 - Down button: While the menu is showing, press the Down button to move the cursor down the submenu. When the menu is not showing, you can use the Down button to take macro pictures.
 - Left button: When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, pressing the Left button makes the cursor shift to the left tab.
 - When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the Left button operates as the FLASH button.
 - Right button: When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, pressing the Right button makes the cursor shift to the right tab.
 - When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, you can execute a function that was set in the [Custom] menu by pressing this button.
 - MENU/ OK button: If the menu is displayed, use the 5-Function buttons to change the data values and for your changes to be accepted.
 - If the menu is not displayed, press the MENU/ OK button to display a menu for the current camera mode on the LCD. Press the button again to return to the previous state.

White balance

The white balance control allows you to adjust the colours to appear more natural looking.



- How to set the white balance
 - 1. Press the WB (Up) button and a white balance icon will display on the LCD monitor.
 - 2. Select a desired white balance by rotating the Rear jog dial (JOG2).

How to set the custom white balance
 White balance settings may vary slightly depending on the shooting environment.
 You can select the most appropriate white balance setting for a given shooting environment by setting up the custom white balance.

 Select the CUSTOM () menu of the White Balance.

You can select CUSTOM 1 or CUSTOM 2 white balance.

- Place a sheet of white paper in front of the camera so that the LCD shows only white, and then press the SHUTTER button. The flash may fire according to the shooting condition.
- 3. The value you set will be saved.
- The custom white balance value will be applied, starting with the next picture you take.
- The user configured white balance will remain effective until it is overwritten.

How to set the colour temperature

Colour temperature is a simplified way to characterize the light source. Low colour temperature implies warmer light (more red) while high colour temperature implies a colder light (more blue).

- Select the colour temperature (K) by rotating the Rear jog dial (JOG2).

- Press the Play & Pause button while playing the movie clip. Then press the Shutter button.

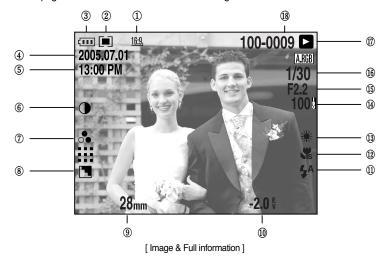

Thumbnail button/ Enlargement button

- In Play mode, you can use the buttons and the jog dial on the camera to conveniently set up the Play mode functions.
- You can view multiple pictures, enlarge a selected picture, and crop and save a selected area of an image.
- Thumbnail display
 - While an image is displayed full screen, press the Thumbnail button ().
 - The thumbnail display will highlight the image that had been showing at the time the thumbnail mode was selected.

- Change the number of thumbnails by rotating the Front jog dial (JOG1). You can select 4, 9, 16, 25 thumbnails.

- Rotate the Rear jog dial (JOG2) or press the Up/ Down/ Left/ Right button to move to a desired image.

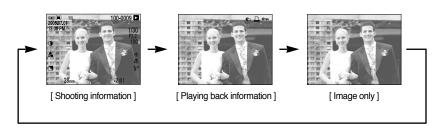
- You can tell whether the image displayed is an enlarged view by checking the image enlargement indicator shown at the bottom left of the LCD. (If the image is not an enlarged view, the indicator will not be displayed.) You can also check the area of enlargement.
- RAW, TIFF and Movie clip files can't be enlarged.
- If an image is enlarged, a loss of quality may occur while the image is playing back.
- During the image enlargement, you can delete the image by pressing the delete button.
- When a rotated image (refer to page 123, Auto rotating sensor) is enlarged, the image is rotated vertically and enlarged. After completing the enlargement, the image will be rotated horizontally.
- Trimming: You can extract part of the image that you want and save it separately.

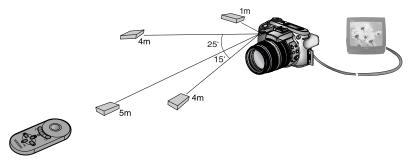

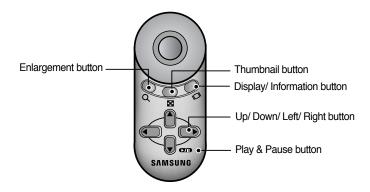

Starting the slide show

- Images can be displayed continuously at pre-set intervals. You can view the slide show by connecting the camera to an external monitor.
 - In play mode, press the Menu button and select the [▶] menu tab.
 - 2. Press the Right button and select the [Slide Show] menu by pressing the Up/ Down button.
 - Press the Right button and select a desired sub menu by pressing the Up/ Down button.



- Setting play interval: Set the slide show play interval.
 - Select the [Interval] menu by pressing the Up/ Down button and press the Right button.

- If you protect an image, the protect icon will be displayed by pressing the Display/ Information button on the LCD. (An unprotected image has no indicator)
- An image in LOCK mode will be protected from the delete function, but will NOT be protected from the Format function.



Deleting images

- Of all the files stored in the memory card, the unprotected files in the DCIM subfolder will be deleted. Remember that this will permanently delete unprotected images. Important shots should be stored on a computer before deletion takes place. The startup image is stored in the camera's internal memory (i.e., not on the memory card) and it will not be deleted even if you delete all files on the memory card.
- How to delete images
 - 1. In play mode, press the Menu button.
 - Select the [▶] menu tab and press the Right button.
 - 3. Select the [Delete] menu and press the Right button.

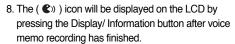

- You can add your voice to a stored still image.
- How to add a voice to a still image
 - Select an image that you wish to add sound to by pressing the Left/ Right button.
 - Select the [▶] menu by pressing the Menu button and press the Right button.
 - Select the [Voice Memo] menu by pressing the Up/ Down button and press the Right button.
 - Select the [On] menu by pressing the Up/ Down button and press the OK button.

- Press the shutter button to start recording and voice will be recorded to the still image for 10 seconds. While the voice is recording, the recording status window will be displayed as shown alongside.

- Voice memos can't be recorded onto movie clip files.
- A distance of 40cm between you and the camera (microphone) is the best distance to record sound.
- The voice memo will be saved in *.wav format, but has the same file name as the still image to which it corresponds.
- If you add a new voice memo to the still image that already has a voice memo, the existing voice memo will be erased.





Resize

- Change the resolution (size) of pictures taken. Select the [User Image] to save an image to be the start-up image. The resized image will have a new file name.
 - In play mode, press the Menu button and select the [▶] menu tab.
 - Press the Right button and select the [Resize] menu by pressing the Up/ Down button.
 - Press the Right button and select a desired sub menu by pressing the Up/ Down button.
 - Press the OK button and a confirmation window will display.
 - Select the [Yes] menu and press OK button to save the resized image.

INFORMATION

- A large sized image can be resized to a smaller sized image, but not vice versa.
- 3264X2176(3:2) and 3264X1840(16:9) image size files, RAW, TIFF and Movie clip (AVI) files can't be resized.
- You can change the resolution of only those files compressed in the JPEG 4:2:2 format.
- The resized image will have a new file name. The [User Image] image is stored not on the memory card but on the internal memory.
- If the memory capacity is insufficient to store the resized image, a [Card Full!] message will display on the LCD and the resized image will not be stored.

Rotating an image

- You can rotate the stored images by various degrees.

- RAW, TIFF and movie clip can't be rotated.

DPOF

- DPOF(Digital Print Order Format) allows you to embed printing information on your memory card's MISC folder. Select the pictures to be printed and how many prints to make.
- The DPOF indicator will display on the LCD when an image that has DPOF information plays back. Images can then be printed on DPOF printers, or at an increasing number of photo labs.
- This function is not available for Movie clips, RAW and TIFF files.
- Depending on the manufacturer and print model, cancelling the printing may take a little longer for the printer to process.

 - Areas with high explosives or highly flammable materials.
- Do not let the unit come into contact with dust, vinyl goods, or chemicals, such as insecticides, for an extended period of time.
- Sand can be particularly troublesome to cameras.
 - Do not let sand get inside the unit when using it on beaches, coastal dunes, or other areas where there is lots of sand.
 - Doing so may result in failure or may permanently render the unit unusable.
- Handling the camera
 - Never drop the camera or subject it to severe shocks or vibrations.
 - This camera is not waterproof. To avoid dangerous electrical shocks, never hold or operate the camera with wet hands.
 - If you use this camera in wet places, such as beach or pool, do not let water or sand get inside the camera.
- Extremes in temperature may cause problems.
 - If the camera is transferred from a cold to a warm and humid environment, condensation can form on the delicate electronic circuitry. If this occurs, turn the camera off and wait for at least 1 hour until all moisture is dispersed. Moisture build up can also occur in the memory card. If this happens, turn off the camera and remove the memory card. Wait until the moisture has dispersed.

Important notes

- Caution on Using the Lens
 - If the lens is subjected to direct sunlight, it could result in discoloration and deterioration of the image sensor.
 - Pay attention not to get fingerprints or foreign substances on the surface of the lens.
- If the digital camera is not used for a long period, an electric discharge can occur.
 It is a good idea to remove the batteries and the memory card if you do not intend using the camera for an extended period of time.
- If the camera is exposed to an electronic interference, it will turn itself off to protect the memory card.
- Camera Maintenance
 - Use a soft brush (available from photo stores) to gently clean the lens and LCD assemblies. If this does not work, lens-cleaning paper with lens cleaning fluid can be used. Clean the camera body with a soft cloth. Do not allow this camera to come into contact with solvent materials such as benzol, insecticide, thinners etc. This may damage the body shell of the camera and also affect its performance. Rough handling can damage the LCD monitor. Take care to avoid damage and keep the camera in its protective carry case at all times when not in use.
- Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the camera.
- Under certain conditions, static electricity can cause the flash unit to fire. This is not harmful
 to the camera and is not a malfunction
- When images are uploaded or downloaded, the data transfer may be affected by static electricity. In this case, disconnect and re-connect the USB cable before trying the transfer again.
- Before an important event or going on a trip, you should check the camera condition.
 - Take a picture for testing the camera condition and prepare extra batteries.
 - Samsung cannot be held responsible for camera malfunctions.

- → Check [Universal Serial Bus controllers] in Device Manager. Do the following to checks [Universal Serial Bus controllers].

Win 98/ME : Follow [Start \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Control Panel \rightarrow System \rightarrow

Device Manager → Universal Serial Bus controllers].

Win 2000 : Follow [Start \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Control Panel \rightarrow System \rightarrow

Hardware → Device Manager → Universal Serial Bus

controllers].

Win XP : Follow [Start \rightarrow Control Panel \rightarrow Performance and

Maintenance → System → Hardware → Device Manager

→ Universal Serial Bus controllers].

There must be USB Host Controller and USB root hub under [Universal Serial Bus controllers].

In addition, double-click on the USB Universal Host Controller and the USB Root Hub to check if the Device Status states "This device is working properly". If the Device Status says the device is "not working properly", click the "Driver" tab and then click [Update Driver] or [Reinstall Driver].

When all the conditions mentioned above are met, the computer can support the USB interface.

[Case 7]

When using the USB hub.

There may be a problem in connecting the camera to the PC through the USB hub if the PC and the hub are not compatible. Wherever possible, connect the camera to the PC directly.

[Case 8]

Are other USB cables connected to the PC?

The camera may malfunction when it is connected to the PC at the same time as another USB cable. In this case, disconnect the other USB cable, and connect only one USB cable to the camera.

[Case 9]

When I open the Device Manager (by clicking Start \rightarrow (Settings) \rightarrow Control Panel \rightarrow (Performance and Maintenance) \rightarrow System \rightarrow (Hardware) \rightarrow Device Manager), there are 「Unknown Devices」 or 「Other Devices」 entries with a yellow question mark (?) beside them or devices with an exclamation mark (!) beside them.

- → Right-click on the entry with the question (?) or exclamation (!) mark and select "Remove". Restart the PC and connect the camera the again. For Windows 98 PC, remove the camera driver also, restart the PC, and then reinstall the camera driver.
- Double-click on the entry with the question (?) or exclamation (!) mark, click the "Driver" tab, and click [Update Driver] or [Reinstall Driver]. If a message appears asking you to specify the location of the appropriate device driver, specify "USB Driver" in the CD supplied.

[Case 10]

In some security programs (Norton Anti Virus, V3, etc.), the computer may not recognise the camera as a removable disk.

→ Stop the security programs and connect the camera to the computer. Refer to the security program instructions about how to stop the program.

- When the movie clip doesn't play back on the PC
- ** When the movie clip recorded by the camera doesn't play back on the PC, the causes are mostly due to the codec installed on the PC.
- When the DirectX 9.0 or later is not installed
 - → Install the DirectX 9.0 or later
 - 1) Insert the CD provided with the camera
 - 2) Run the windows explorer and select [CD-ROM drive:\USB Driver\DirectX 9.0] folder and click the DXESETUP.exe file. The DirectX will be installed. Visit the following site for downloading the DirectX.http://www.microsoft.com/directx

FAQ

- If a PC (Windows 98) stops responding while the camera and PC are connected repeatedly
 - → If a PC (Windows 98) is turned on for a long time and the camera is connected repeatedly the PC may not recognise the camera. In this case, re-start the PC.
- If a PC connected with the camera stops responding while Windows is starting.
 - → In this case, disconnect the PC and the camera and Windows will start. If the problem happens continuously, set the Legacy USB Support to disable and re-start the PC. The Legacy USB Support is in the BIOS setup menu. (The BIOS setup menu differs from the PC manufacturers and some BIOS menus don't have Legacy USB Support) If you can't change the menu by yourself, contact to the PC manufacturer or BIOS manufacturer.
- If the movie clip can't be deleted, removable disk can't be extracted or an error message displays during the file transfer.
 - → If you install only the Digimax Master, the problems mentioned above occasionally happen.
 - Close the Digimax Master, program by clicking the Digimax Master icon on the Taskbar.
 - Install all the application programs included in the software CD.
